

God's Word

5th Sunday of Easter/May 15, 2022

First Reading:

They called the church together and reported what God had done with them. (Acts 14:27)

I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. (Jn 13:34)



REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"Love One Another as I have Loved You" (John 13:35)

This Sunday Gospel is part of the Last Supper event. This was after Judas Iscariot left the Upper Room and after Jesus washed the disciples' feet. Jesus then gives his most important teaching and command to his disciples, the core of the entire Gospel proclamation: "A new commandment I give unto you, that you love one another as I have loved you." Following this commandment is the sole way by which we will be known as Christians, followers of Christ. Self-sacrificing love is the true mark of a Christian. In Jesus' new commandment, not only are we to love our neighbor as ourselves, now we are to love them as Christ loved, with a sacrificial love.

Thinking of sacrificial love, the first memory we have as human beings is the love of our mothers. We celebrated joyfully our mothers last Sunday and thanked them for their love for us. We acknowledged their love which involved lots of sacrifices. And Jesus invites us today to think of God's love, manifested in Jesus who sacrificed his love for us, and follow his example, even to the point of dying for us.

The word for love used in John 13:35 is agape, which is a love that goes further than brotherly/ sisterly love; it is based in covenant relationship. Agape love is unselfish love found only in the heart of the Trinity and demonstrated in the life of Christ. As Christ loved the world with a sacrificial outpouring of self, we are to love one another. We are commanded to give ourselves to one another with the hope that all of us will be fully formed to Christ. This is difficult and requires a dying to ourselves. In order to agape one another we must listen to each other, reason with each other, and find common ground to show forth the love of Christ in the community. This is the invitation and challenge Jesus offers us this Sunday – to love one another as Jesus loved us. This is how we evangelize and become the Church we are called to be. Remember how the early Christian community attracted gentiles to Christ. "Seeing their love, gentiles came to believe in Jesus". Seeing our love for one another let's attract others to Christ.

THE MASS

THE ORDO, THE ROMAN MISSAL,
THE LECTIONARY AND BOOK OF THE GOSPELS,
THE ORDER OF WORSHIP

There are several liturgical books of the Catholic Church that help us to celebrate the Mass as a Universal Church. Each of these books has its own function and use at Mass.

The Ordo

The word "ordo" is a Latin word meaning to set in a row. The Ordo of the Catholic Church is published each year as the calendar and the description of each liturgical celebration for every day in the year. It gives the direction of what scripture readings are used to the proper color of



the vestments. This common Ordo also clarifies any confusion of dates that may overlap. Some liturgical dates are fixed on the same date annually, such as Christmas is always December 25, and other feasts are moveable depending on the date of Easter each year. All of that is spelled out in detail in the Ordo, keeping the liturgy of the Church in order.

The Roman Missal

For the first few centuries of the Church, the celebration of the Mass was not as centralized as it is today. The first collections of Mass prayers were gathered under Pope Leo the Great (440-461) and it was not until 1474 that the term "Roman Missal" was used.

The Roman Missal, the big red book on the altar used by the priest, is the book that contains the prescribed prayers, chants, and instructions for the celebration of the Mass. Published first in Latin as the "Misalle Romanum," this version is the standard by which all translations are made universally. Every translation of the Missal is submitted to the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments for approval of their translation into a modern language. Our English translation is used in all English-speaking countries throughout the world.

The Lectionary and Book of the Gospels

The Lectionary was revised by decree of Vatican Council II in 1970 to a three-year cycle for Sundays. This arrangement of readings allows us to hear nearly 60% of the New Testament and 4% of the Old Testament at Mass. The format of a three-year cycle is based on the Gospels: year A from St. Matthew, year B from St. Mark, year C from St. Luke. The Gospel of St. John is used during Lent, Holy Week and Easter each year and part of year B "When Celebrating the Liturgy, the Church proclaims both the Old [Testament] and the New Testament it is proclaiming one and the same mystery of Christ." (LM #5).

The Book of the Gospels is a part of the Lectionary of Readings but is separated for use at Mass by the deacon (or priest). This book contains written accounts, by the Evangelists, of the life and words of Jesus Christ.

The Order of Worship

The weekly Order of Worship (or hymnal) belongs to the assembly. Parts of the Mass are led by various ministers and ritual books, the responses, sung parts, and affirmation of the work of salvation belongs to the whole Church. The Order of Worship gives us our voice at Mass.
