

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

"Jesus is taken to heaven and the disciples remain in Jerusalem awaiting his sending of the Spirit"

Today is our liturgical celebration of the Ascension of the Lord, when Jesus was taken to heaven on the 40th day after Easter. In the readings for this feast we have two accounts of the ascension: one at the end of Luke's gospel, closing the period of his earthly ministry; the other at the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles and the beginning of the church's mission.

Through these two accounts, Luke emphasizes the historical continuity of the mystery of the risen Christ. Ascension is celebrated usually on the fortieth day of the resurrection. Think about the symbolism of forty days in the Bible. Forty is the biblical number of transition to a new stage of salvation history; from desert wanderings to the land of Canaan; from Jesus wilderness experience to his public ministry; from earthly presence of Jesus to his presence in the Spirit in the community of believers.

For forty days the apostles are to be in the company of the risen Jesus, eat with him, and wait for the Holy Spirit, the promise of the Father, who will be given to them. The earthly ministry of Jesus having been completed, in these "forty days" Jesus instructs his apostles about the beginning and continuing mission of the church. It is to be in the power of the Holy Spirit, its members believing in his risen presence, eating at table, witnessing beyond Jerusalem to the ends of the earth, and gathering and waiting together in joyful expectation.

The ascension points to the need for Pentecost and the driving spirit-filled passion that will make the disciples the witnesses of Jesus throughout the world until he comes again.

Those who believe in Jesus will be empowered to do what Jesus himself has done. Jesus sent his disciples out to continue his mission. Now, we are sent again to do these things and more. From his place with God in heaven, Jesus helped his disciples, and he continues to help us as we try to live as his followers. Let us prayerfully now wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit to fill us and our community with new enthusiasm, courage and power to proclaim the Good News.

THE MASS

SEVEN SUPPORTING LITURGICAL MINISTRIES AT MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP PARISH: HOSPITALITY, LITURGICAL ENVIRONMENT, SACRISTAN, MINISTER OF MUSIC, ALTAR SERVER, LECTOR, AND EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION.

"The celebration of the Eucharist is the action of Christ and the Church, namely, of the holy people of God ..." (GIRM #91) It is Christ who invites us to his feast, he is present to us as we serve one another. Our parish is blessed with holy people who serve the church in many ministries.



Ministry of Hospitality/Usher

St. Paul instructed the assembled community to "welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you to the glory of God" (Romans 15:7) "The people are coming as invited guests of the Lord himself, to share in his supper as sisters and brothers." (Introduction to the Order of Mass, #23).

Ministry of the Liturgical Environment

The liturgical seasons are highlighted by the adornment of the church that supports the authentic worship in a way that is "truly worthy and beautiful ... symbols of heavenly realities." (GIRM # 288)

Ministry of Sacristan

This is a person "who diligently arranges the liturgical books, the vestments, and other things that are necessary for the celebration of Mass." (GIRM #105)

Ministry of Music: Cantor, Choir, Instrumentalist

Liturgical music is an art placed at the service of communal prayer. "Music should assist the assembled believers to express and share the gift of faith that is within them and to nourish and strengthen their interior commitment of faith ... It imparts a sense of unity to the Assembly and sets the appropriate tone for a particular celebration." (Music in Catholic Worship, #23).

Ministry of Altar Server

"Assistance at the altar by servers represents a long liturgical tradition. These servers enhance the quality of celebration for the whole gathered assembly by taking part in processions and by ensuring that all items required for the celebration are available at the appropriate moments." (Introduction to the Order of Mass, #22).

Ministry of Lector

"When the Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to His people, and Christ, present in His own Word, proclaims the Gospel. Therefore, all must listen with reverence to the readings from God's Word, for they make up an element of greatest importance in the Liturgy." (General Instruction of the Roman Missal #29).

Ministry of Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion

In this ministry, you must be examples of Christian living in faith and conduct; you must strive to grow in holiness through this sacrament of unity and love. Remember that, though many, we are one body because we share the one bread and one cup. As ministers of Holy Communion be, therefore, especially observant of the Lord's command to love your neighbor. For when he gave his body as food to his disciples, he said to them: "This is my commandment, that you should love one another as I have loved you." (Book of Blessings # 1875)
