Mass Schedule Changes

MPH will move from Four Sunday Masses to Three Sunday Masses on Pentecost

Our parish leadership team has been discerning and discussing the current Mass schedule over the past several months. We feel that it is more practical to have three Masses on Sundays instead of four for the following reasons.

- The overall attendance of the Sunday Masses is less than 30% of the Church capacity.
- We do not have sufficient volunteers to cover all the Masses as Sacristans, Ushers, Eucharistic Ministers, Greeters, Lectors and Servers.
- The time gap between the morning Masses is too short and inconvenient.
- Reducing one Mass on Sunday will help us financially.

Therefore, after much discernment, the decision has been made to change the Sunday Mass Schedule from four Masses (8:00, 9:30, 11:00 and 7:00 pm) to three Masses, 8:30 am, 10:30 am and 7:00 pm, beginning the weekend of June 4/5, 2022 (Pentecost Sunday). The Saturday vigil Mass will continue at 4:00 pm.

Thank you for your understanding and openness to this change.

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. Matthew

"I am the Good Shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me"

Fourth Sunday of Easter is called Good Shepherd Sunday. One of the most enduring and endearing images of Jesus is that of the Good Shepherd who guides and lays down his life for his sheep. The image of Jesus as Good Shepherd and the community of followers as his sheep has endured over the centuries as a primary image in our faith tradition. Its power to describe the relationship between Jesus and his followers transcends direct experience with sheep. The image speaks to us about the protection, security, and care that shepherds represent for their sheep.

As I write this reflection, I am attending the Spring Assembly of the priests serving the Archdiocese of Milwaukee with our Shepherds Archbishop Listecki, Auxiliary Bishops Jeffrey Haines. Schuerman, and Bishop Sklba. How timely the shepherds of Christ gathering together for prayer, reflection and fellowship to renew our commitment to become the shepherds the Lord has called us to be. We are reflecting on the theme "Heart of the Priesthood". Today we also pray for vocations to priesthood and religious, life so that the Church gets new shepherds to guide us. Please continue to pray for all your shepherd, that we may become good shepherds like Jesus.

Today's Gospel speaks powerfully about the familiarity and intimacy between Jesus and his disciples, expressed as recognizing and knowing another's voice. The key to this relationship is our ability to listen to the voice of the Shepherd. Once we hear and listen to His voice, we cannot be indifferent in regard to him. We have to give our whole selves to him, without compromise or hesitation. Once we hear his voice, we have to drop everything and follow.

Today we also celebrate and honor our mothers who continue to touch our lives with their love and care. Let us thank God for all our mothers, living and deceased, and pray for them. May their influence continue to transform the world. May our Mother of Perpetual Help intercede for us and bless all our mothers.

THE MASS

THE PRESENCE OF CHRIST AT MASS

IN THE EUCHARIST, IN THE PERSON OF THE PRIEST, IN THE WORD, AND IN THE ASSEMBLY



A key principle from Vatican Council II in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy is that Christ is present in the liturgy in four unique ways; "in the Eucharist broken and shared [Holy Communion]; in the person of the minister [the ordained priest]; in the Word of God [Sacred Scripture]; and in the assembled people of God [all of us] (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, CSL #7). We are reminded that when we celebrate the Mass that Christ is with us in more than one way.

In the Eucharist

The first way Christ is present to us at Mass is in the "Eucharistic species," this is the preeminent presence of Christ with his Church. Christ is present in the bread and wine that become his Body and Blood. What looks like bread and wine has truly become Christ's Body and Christ's Blood. By the "taking, blessing, breaking and sharing" we recognize Christ in one another and bring him to the world by the way we live our lives. Therefore, when we receive Jesus in Holy Communion, we become even more the Body of Christ. "We become," as St. Augustine teaches us, "what we eat and drink."

In the Person of the Priest

The second way in which Christ is with us in the liturgy is in the person of the minister, the priest calls the community together and leads the community in prayer. When he does so, he acts in the person of Christ (in persona Christi), on our behalf. The priest does this "by the way he acts and speaks, with dignity, reverence, and humility, so that the living presence of Christ is conveyed in and through him" (GIRM #93).

In the Word

The third form in which Christ is present to us, in any liturgy we celebrate, is in the Word of God. Whether at Mass, the other sacraments, or the Liturgy of the Hours, we always hear the Word of God proclaimed in scripture. Whether that reading is from the Old or New Testament, Christ is present in that Word. In the beginning of John's Gospel, we hear that Christ IS the Word of God. He is God speaking to us, each time we hear God's Word, from the law, the prophets, a psalm, the Gospels, a letter, or any other Scripture passage, Christ is present in his Holy Word with us.

In the Assembly

The fourth way Christ is present to us is in the assembled People of God. In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which guides priests and other liturgical ministers in celebrating the Mass, we read of "his presence in the assembled people of God." (GIRM #27) Christ is present when the assembly is gathered in his name. This is just as he had promised: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20). That is to say, every time we come together to pray and sing in any of the Church's liturgies, Christ is present in and with each of us.




