Our Parish Icons

The word "icon" is a Greek word meaning image. It is the same word used in the Bible "God created man in His image" (Genesis 1:27), He created man in His *eikōn*.

Mother of Perpetual Help

Our Mother of Perpetual Help icon is the principal image and title of our parish. This beloved Byzantine image is believed to have originated between the 13th-15th centuries, growing in popularity as the devotions to Mary flourished. This image is known for being miraculous over the centuries, attributed to countless healings and special graces.

MP (left) θY (right) are the first and last letters of the Greek words for Mother of God. The star on the head of Mary reminds us that she is the dawn announcing the coming of Jesus, the one who leads us to Christ. Mary's eyes are filled with compassion and love as she gazes upon us, her children. Her eyes draw her children toward Christ whom she holds in her arms. Her garment is a bright red symbolizing her virginity, and blue a symbol of her motherhood; both colors depict her as queen.



The archangels that appear over the image are holding in their veiled hands the articles of Christ's crucifixion. Michael (left) holds a pole with the sponge soaked in vinegar. Gabriel (right) holds the cross and nails. The child Jesus is frightened by this vision he sees and clings to the safety of his mother's arms, while at the same time she is presenting her Son as the Word of God. Her flat right-hand points directly into the heart of the Christ Child and to the cross of his passion.

The face of Christ looks out beyond the vision of his passion to the future of our redemption. His figure is that of a child, but the face appears more mature with wisdom beyond our understanding. The hands of Jesus are perfectly united with his mother's, the perfect conformity of Mary's will with Christ and together with him she participates in his work of redemption. His green tunic symbolizes his humanity and all of creation, the red sash represents his blood shed for our salvation, and the gold is the color of his resurrection. Together his garments sum up the entire Paschal Mystery of Incarnation, Passion, Death, and Resurrection. The falling sandal reminds us that Christ was human like us in all things but sin. The gold background represents the divine light of heaven. Since we do not know what heaven looks like the color allows us to let our imagination flow, contemplating all things divine.



Sacred Heart of Jesus

The image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is not an image found among traditional Greek icons. This is a later depiction of Christ in an ancient art form. This image uses some of the ancient traditions to create this depiction. Above Christ's Head are the letters "IC" and "XC" the first and last letters in Greek of Jesus the Christ. "O MAN TO" (left) "K PA TW P" in Greek is "O Pantocrator" translated as "Almighty," "All Powerful," "strength," "might" and "power." The gold background is the divine light of heaven.

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

"Do not be afraid...not a hair on your head will be destroyed" Luke 21: 5-19

The readings for this 33rd week make us think about the end of the world. In the first reading we are told that the day of the Lord is coming. The psalm assures us that "The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice." In the second reading Paul asks that we diligently work for the good of all. In the gospel Jesus speaks about the end times and perseverance.

Our Gospel for this Sunday opens with Jesus' disciples admiring the splendor of the Temple, the most beautiful, important, and impressive building they had ever seen. Jesus bluntly reminds them: 'Not one stone of this temple will be left upon another, but it will all be torn down!" Jesus tells them that destruction is coming and those who follow him will be persecuted. Understandably worried, they ask when it will happen and how they will know it's going to happen. Jesus responds in an eschatological way, referencing the end of the world. After describing the terrible things, natural and man-made calamities and destructions, Jesus comforts them with these words: immediately vour perseverance you will secure your lives."

All things pass away. Political and religious institutions, the family, bodily health, nothing lasts. Everything dies. So often we seek our fulfillment and salvation in these things. Christ is telling us not to, but rather to rely on our relationship with him. As Christians, we don't get terrified by anything that can destroy our temporary realities. This includes all the securities we rely on, here on earth, because we are secure in the loving relationship with God, who will gather us at the end of our lives to our eternal home.

Even when we are persecuted for living the gospel, Jesus assures us "I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute". All we need is to deepen our relationship with God which grounds us and gives us courage. Let us hear again the words of Jesus, "You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives".
