

## **Celebrating the Sacraments**

Baptism is celebrated during or after Mass on the second Sunday of the month. Due to current restrictions, all baptisms will take place after Mass until further notice. A Baptismal preparation class is required. Classes will be held quarterly in 2020/2021, so it is recommended you schedule a class early, possibly before your child is born. You must call the parish office to register for the class and the Baptism.

**Reconciliation (Confession)** At this time reconciliation is by appointment only. Please call the pastor to set up an appointment. A regular schedule for monthly Confession will be announced when available.

Anointing of the Sick Until further notice, individual anointing may be requested by calling the pastor.

Weddings Please call the Parish office to make arrangements no later than 6 months prior to your anticipated date. A process of preparation including participation in an Archdiocesan Engaged Encounter is required of all couples seeking marriage in the church.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

#### November 29, 2020 **1st Sunday of Advent**

You are at the eye doctor and it's time for the peripheral vision test. You know the one. It's where you put your head up to a contraption and have to click a switch every time you see a squiggly line. If you don't concentrate and maintain optimal focus, you will miss them and skew the outcome of the test. You can easily find yourself with a diagnosis that really isn't accurate! Concentration and focus are key to succeeding with this evaluation. They are also key to developing a healthy, vibrant spiritual life. If we do not bring our full consciousness to the task, concentrate with all our might, be watchful and vigilant, we are not going to see God's loving presence flashing before our eyes!

That's why we need Advent. Let's face it. We can easily get distracted, focus on nonessential and superficial things and lose touch with what really matters. Our attentions wander. We daydream and even become a bit overwhelmed and tired. All of the stresses and demands of life consume us and we find ourselves constantly trying to play catch up rather than relishing the moment of the now. "Now" moments are so fleeting. They flash before us like those squiggly lines on a screen. Present moments go as quickly as they come but it is important to discover them and rest in them as often as we can. Though gone in a flash, these now moments of encounter with God teach powerful lessons and offer a grounding in truth that can be found nowhere else. It's the grace of Advent to become watchful and attentive because we are never sure when God will surprise us.

God loves surprises and love thrives on them! God's now moments of surprises come as tender instants of intimate connection where I find profound peace, experience joy, and rest in love. These are Advent times reflective of the now moments when Christ first was born, when God surprises us during every time we care to watch and when the great surprise of Christ's second coming dawns upon us all. But, to discover the grandeur and experience the awe of these now times, we have to be ready. We have to want to be there. We have to believe. And, we have to have the desire to soak in as much as we can in the time we have before us.

When we opened our doors to in person learning in August, we made the promise to stay open as long as we were able to keep our school community safe. Unfortunately, with the rapid acceleration of community spread and the current positivity rate, we simply can't guarantee the safety of the school community. We have made the difficult decision to transition to remote learning beginning on November 30 and continuing until at least January 20. We will continue to provide excellent instruction remotely for all of our students and will do everything we can to keep our kids engaged and moving forward. ### Catholics and the Mystery of Death VI: Final Thoughts

**Praying for Those Who Have Died:** In the Apostles' Creed we proclaim our belief in 'the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, and the *communion of saints*.' Gabe Huck explains: "We speak and act as if there is a bond between we who live and those who have died." This is one of the implications of our belief in the communion of saints. Christians are "people who need people." During the month of November we emphasize these "family ties" in our liturgy to remind ourselves that we are united with those who have gone before us and that we can count on their prayers. We also pray in a special way for our beloved dead. We commend them to God's mercy and, at the same time, plead for them to intercede for us. The bonds of baptism that unite us to this Church of ours-to each other and to God--are strong, stronger even than death. We call this to mind this wonderful reality during our prayer this month.

**Donation of Bodies or Body Parts:** "To give the gift of life to others after we have no further use of our "earthen vessels" is most commendable and Christian. Therefore, donation of bodies or portions of bodies for transplant or medical research is encouraged..." In some cases the body will be available for funeral services. If the body is not available, a Eucharistic liturgy or a memorial service without the body present may be celebrated.

**Genealogical Research and Catholic Cemeteries:** Did you know if you have access to the Internet, you can find a wealth of information about family members and friends who are buried in a Catholic cemetery in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee? Simply go to <u>www.cemeteries.org/genealogy.asp</u>. Then type in a last name or part of the name and you will be directed to information concerning the deceased's dates of death and birth, burial location, home address, etc. This can be helpful for locating a gravesite or filling in blanks in a family's family tree.
