GOD'S WORD

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time / November 7, 2021

First Reading:

She left and did as Elijah had said. She was able to eat for a year, and he and her son as well; the jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, as the LORD had foretold through Elijah. (1 Kgs 17:15-16)

"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." (Mk 12:43-44)



A NOTE FROM FR. MATTHEW

An Act of Profound Generosity

This weekend's readings focus on the generosity of two widows. In the first book of Kings, a widow makes the prophet Elijah a cake out of the last handful of flour and a bit of oil she had reserved for herself and her son. In the gospel, Jesus lifts up the sacrificial giving of a widow who places "a few cents" in the temple treasury. Although these women have little, they give freely what they do possess. Jesus is commending her because her small offering was an act of profound generosity, giving from her livelihood rather than her surplus.

To give from our livelihood is not only an act of generosity, it is also an act of trust in God. We can only give from our need if we trust that God will provide for us. Jesus himself demonstrates the ultimate act of generosity and trust in God as he gives his life for us on the cross.

Jesus's words give us insight into the mind of God, where the wealthy and poor are equal, and the generosity of one is not greater than that of another, even though the monetary value may differ. It also sharpens our eyes to recognize the many small and humble actions that happen around us each and every day. St. Teresa of Calcutta famously stated, "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love". It seems that to God, the small things done with great love are really the most important actions.

Each of us are given the opportunity to generously give of ourselves as the widow does in today's gospel. If we closely look into the history of our churches, we can see that it was built by the generous and sacrificial giving of all of you, big and small. Just like Jesus appreciated the widow, I want to thank each one of you for generously supporting and helping our parish community to grow and become a good neighbor to those in need. May the Lord reward us for all our sacrifices and generosity.

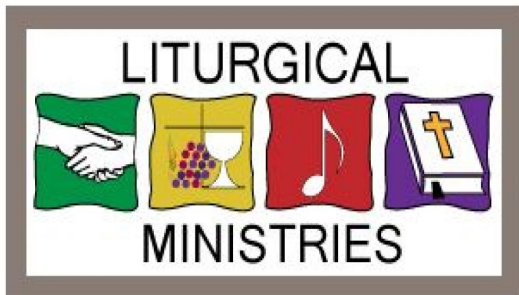
