God's Word

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time / October 10, 2021

First Reading:

I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne, and deemed riches nothing in comparison with her. (Wis 7:7-8)

"Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." (Mk 10:21)



A NOTE FROM Fr. Matthew

We continue our faith journey with Jesus as his disciples and this Sunday Jesus challenges us to examine what comes in between our desire to follow Jesus and pursue eternal life. Like the young man in the gospel, we may have possessions that we struggle to let go to possess Jesus as our greatest treasure.

We all know we need to work hard and earn enough wealth to live our lives happily. But we are also aware that if our priorities are not properly set, our pursuit of wealth can lead us away from the Lord and our loved ones. When we become too much pre-occupied by our possessions we may lose those that are more important in our lives. It is in this context we have to listen to Jesus's words to the young man and ask personally, what is the Lord asking me to do to be on our path to eternal life.

On October 4th we celebrated the great Saint Francis who heard the voice of the Lord to "Rebuild my Church" and literally left everything and followed the Lord as his sole aim and passion. He felt his possessions were a stumbling block to follow the Lord radically and became the greatest reformer of the Church. We may not have to leave everything to rebuild the Church today. But if love of the Lord becomes our first priority, we can begin the process of rebuilding our little parish community. Like Francis, if we can leave the comfort of our familiar ways of being the Church and start sharing our talents, time and treasure for the Lord and His people, we can create a new parish community to witness the joy of living the Gospel in our community. Wealth is not just money but every gift we possess. If we become more generous with all that we have to create a world according to the vision of God, we truly become His disciples. When we give generously with love without counting the cost, the Lord will reward us with the greatest treasure- Eternal Life.

I thank you all for your continued generosity in supporting and building our parish community with all your treasures and gifts. May the Lord bless us to be more generous.
