

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

"Pray Always Without Becoming Weary" Luke 18:1-8

The readings for today are about persistence in prayer. In the first reading Moses becomes tired in prayer and Aaron and Hur support him. The psalm declares "Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth". In the second reading Paul tells us to be persistent in proclaiming the Word of God. In the gospel Jesus tells the parable of the Persistent Widow, who kept bothering the judge until he heard her.

In this parable, Jesus uses the example of the widow who continues to ask, over and over, for what she justly deserves until a disinterested party, the judge, relents and gives in. If this judge, who can't be bothered to do his job, relents in the face of persistence, how much more will our Lord, who desires to help us, be moved?

If we are to understand Jesus's words, however, we must begin to understand prayer as a lived reality, something we do everyday. Only when we live our lives as a prayer – when we know that everything we do connects us to the God who loves us – can we begin to pray without ceasing. Prayer, then, is less about what we do or say and more about relationship with God.

Part of growing in relationship with God is growing in transparency with God. God knows our heart and all our needs. God knows us better than we know ourselves and God knows our needs better than we can possibly express. Instead we share our needs with God so that we might grow in greater transparency with God. Part of growing in relationship with anyone is practicing authenticity, where one can simply be one's self around another person. When we are able to live authentically and grow as the person we are called to be, we are indeed living lives of prayer.

Pope Francis also reminds us that to pray without ceasing is to be keenly aware of the needs of our brothers and sisters. When we put someone else's needs before our own or help meet the spiritual or physical needs of someone, we grow in relationship with Christ. When we live in right relationship with God and others, we can heed Jesus' command and truly pray without ceasing. Let us strive therefore to be Persistent in prayer, not giving up, Trusting in God and supporting each other.
