Intercede for us now with your Son Jesus.


Help our parish to be an instrument in the hands of God.

A NOTE FROM FR. MATTHEW

"Whom shall I send? And I said, 'Here am I, send me" (Is 6:8).

Dear Parish family,

Today the Church celebrates World Mission Sunday. This is a powerful reminder to each one of us individually as Christians and as a parish community how we become missionaries in our times. We read from prophet Isaiah,

Church on earth by its very nature is missionary. All those who have received baptism have the vocation to actively participate in this responsibility. We have met Christ in our lives and have a personal relationship with Him. All those who have not had this privilege also have the right to encounter Him. Those who haven't heard the love of Christ have the right to hear.. and we should be bearers of that Good News to them. Unless we share our faith, how can they know Him and experience Him? So, let's share the joy of our Christian faith with everyone we encounter in our lives.

Sometimes we think being a missionary means to go far and preach the Good News to the people who haven't heard of Christ. I read last week in Catholic Herald about St. Teresa of Culcutta, perhaps one of the most prolific missionaries of our times, encouraged people to find their own Culcutta - to find the people in need of help close by and minister to them. Here in our parish and in our own homes, we have great opportunities to be a great missionary.

I am so proud of our various ministries in the parish through which we reach out to people in need and remind them how much Christ loves them even in their struggles and suffering. Visiting the sick or an elderly person, feeding the hungry, supporting the homeless, forgiving the ones who hurt us, counseling the doubtful and above all praying for those in need.... the list goes on. I pray that our parish become more missionary as each of us find some ways to share the joy of the Gospel with one another and live our baptismal call to be missionaries more actively.

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus giving sight to Bartimaeus, the blind man. Even though he was physically blind, he saw through the eyes of faith it was Jesus who was his Savior and cried out. Jesus responded to his call and blessed him with physical sight. Flame of faith alive in us help others who might be living in darkness.

May the Lord open our eyes and help us to spread the Joy of the Gospel around us.



WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

OCTOBER 24, 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee:

Pope Francis' message for the year reflects on the theme: "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard".

(Acts 4:20) He reminds us that, "As Christians, we cannot keep the Lord to ourselves" as we "recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel."

Reflecting on 2020, we all struggled with social distancing and being away from our family, friends, and community: We, for example, were unable to welcome missioners due to Covid-19 travel restrictions, removing those in-person connections that had previously been part of our Sunday Eucharist. Instead, we used technology to help share the Gospel from around the world, and we are blessed that your support of the missionary call was still evident.

As we celebrate the generosity of prayers, time and monetary support, we are invited to "own" and to bring to others what we bear in our hearts. This mission has always been the hallmark of the Church, for "she exists to evangelize"

(Saint Paul VI, Evangelii Nuntiandi, 14)

We are invited to fight the temptation of isolation caused by the pandemic, social injustices and other transgressions against each other. We are charged to respond to the call of a faith-filled life that includes a growing openness to embracing everyone, everywhere.

Without a doubt, the faithful of the Archdiocese have themselves been missionaries as well, as you have borne "witness to what they had seen and heard: the good news that the Kingdom of God is at hand. They did so with the generosity, gratitude and nobility typical of those who sow seeds in the knowledge that others will enjoy the fruit of their efforts and sacrifice. I like to think that "even those who are most frail, limited and troubled can be missionaries in their own way, for goodness can always be shared, even if it exists alongside many limitations."
