Reflections from Fr. Matthew

"Today Salvation has come to this house" Luke 19:1-10

In today's gospel we hear the story of Jesus entering into the life of Zacchaeus, a chief tax collector. After a brief exchange with each other, Jesus invites himself to stay in Zacchaeus' house with the story ending with a great statement from Jesus, "Today Salvation has come to this house."

Even before Jesus comes to his home, Zacchaeus shows himself to be someone in search of salvation. Zacchaeus, described as short in stature, climbs a tree in order to see Jesus. We know from Luke's description that Zacchaeus was no ordinary tax collector. He was, in fact, the chief tax collector and a person of some wealth. In his search for salvation, he humbled himself by making a spectacle of himself by climbing a tree.

Jesus recognizes the faith of this tax collector exhibited in his search for salvation, and calls him down from the tree. In the hospitality he extends to Jesus, and in his conversion of heart, Zacchaeus is raised up by Jesus as a model of salvation. Once lost Zacchaeus, now finds himself in the right place – in relationship with Jesus. Like Zacchaeus, Jesus is calling us today by name to enter into a new relationship with him to be transformed and saved.

This coming week, we also celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints and Commemorate all the Faithful departed. We are reminded of both our origin and destination as we celebrate these special days of our Christian life. Created in the image and likeness of God, we are called to be saints, we fail sometimes by our sin and human frailty, but are redeemed and saved by Jesus Christ.

Let us gratefully acknowledge and pray for all our **faithful departed** that the Lord may show mercy upon them and grant them eternal life.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.


with her warm smile. She went to her eternal reward on **Thursday, October 20th.** We express our sincere sympathy and prayers to her family, and may her soul rest in peace.

Frequently Asked Questions about Pledges:

Who is being asked to pledge to the Love One Another Campaign?

All households in all parishes of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee will be asked to prayerfully consider a five-year commitment.

Why does the campaign request five-year pledges?

Pledges payable over five years allow families to budget their contributions in monthly or annual payments. Most of us can make larger commitments over time than we might be able to all-at-once. Five-year pledges help ensure we can meet our parish's campaign goal and fund the needs of the parish and important Catholic ministries in our 10 counties of southeastern Wisconsin.

When do pledge payments begin?

Each family determines the timing and frequency of their pledge payments and how payments are made.
