REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

Living in Gratitude through Generous Love

Luke 17:11-19

Today we hear about how Jesus, continuing on his journey to Jerusalem, heals 10 lepers. This story is a lesson about faith and reminds us that faith is sometimes found in unlikely places. Ten people afflicted with leprosy cry out to Jesus. Struck with pity, Jesus heals all 10. Sadly, only one is described as glorifying God and returning to thank Jesus. This one who returns is a Samaritan, a foreigner. In the Jewish circles in which Jesus lived, Samaritans were looked down upon because of the differences between the two communities in their observance of Judaism. It is significant, therefore, that Jesus commends the Samaritan for his faith, which has been his salvation. Throughout Luke's Gospel, faith is found in surprising places.

Another lesson for us in this Gospel has to do with salvation. All 10 of the lepers were given the gift of healing, but due to his gratitude to God for this gift, the Samaritan found salvation. Our salvation is found in recognizing the gifts we have been given and knowing to whom we must offer our thanks.

We have each received the gift of faith and all the blessings from God from the beginning of our life. Today's gospel reminds us to give thanks to God for all those blessings, many of which we take for granted. Think about our parents and all the sacrifices they made to raise us as good human beings and Christians.

The other day, I was walking through the campus of Marquette University with a Jesuit friend of mine and came across "The Gratitude Garden" in which it was written: "At the culmination of the Spiritual Exercises, St. Ignatius draws us toward gratitude for the many ways God labors on our behalf. Why? Because gratitude is the wellspring of a joyful, generous heart that can rise above challenges with actions rooted in love. May your time in this place of reflection nourish your heart with gratitude. May it move from gratitude through generous love to be the difference our world needs".

I felt this is beautiful summary of the message of the gospel today. Let us make "The Gratitude Garden" in our hearts, homes and the parish.
