## REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

## "The Person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones" (Lk 16:10)

As I write this reflection for this Sunday, I feel the readings are specifically speaking to me as your pastor, entrusted with the care of our parish community. The gospel story is about good stewardship. We are all called to be good stewards of the gifts the Lord has entrusted to us. We are all accountable to God and one another. After sharing about the dishonest but prudent steward, Jesus reminds us that those who are trustworthy in small matters are entrusted with great ones.

The key message of the gospel is to become the "children of light" as opposed to the "children of this world". Jesus invites us to be more alert and enterprising, ready to risk everything because we rely on the mercy and love of God. "What will I do?" is a question for each of us as a disciple and trustworthy steward of the rich property of God's household, not only of the material resources that are to be shared with those in need, but especially of the mysteries of God.

As I formally become your pastor this week, the second reading from Paul's letter to Timothy is very specially addressed to our parish family. Let me ask each one of you as my beloved parishioners "to offer supplications, prayers, petitions and thanksgiving" for me as your shepherd to guide you as a good steward of the mysteries of God. It is only by the grace of God and your prayers that I can serve you faithfully as a good shepherd. I am grateful to each one of you who are praying for me and our parish community. May the Lord who entrusted me with this responsibility be my strength. Together as "good stewards" and "children of light" we become beacons of Christ's light in the world.
