Having heard the many voices and with the changed circumstances of the merger plan from 2018, I feel it is helpful to continue the Mass of Anticipation at 4:00pm on Saturdays at the 116th and Greenfield site. The Church cannot be decommissioned as we will continue to have the school Masses there. Moreover, I feel it is pastorally prudent to support the needs of the vastly senior and aging members who are attending the 4 pm Mass at the 116th site. Therefore, the 116th site will be our Auxiliary site of the parish. All Sunday Masses, including the 9:30am Mass, will be celebrated at the main site on 106th and Lincoln.

I know many of you will find this decision hard to understand. I feel it is the most pastorally appropriate decision moving forward to rebuild our community as one. Let us continue to build a vibrant and caring community in West Allis that is founded in our rich heritage of Faith and tradition of the three parishes. Let's celebrate our past and thank all who built our faith communities and pray for a new beginning, trusting that it is the Lord who is in charge of our boat.

Our Patroness, Mary, Mother of Perpetual Help will surely be our constant support and mediator with Jesus to become a new community with full of enthusiasm and hope. May she intercede for us always.
