REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

Lazarus and the Rich Man (Luke 16:19-31)

In today's gospel, Jesus is speaking to the Pharisees who "loved money" (Luke 16:14) and who were ridiculing Jesus over what he had said about idolizing wealth over the worship of God. In the parable found in today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the life of a rich man and the poor man, Lazarus, who lives in the shadow of the rich man and his wealth. Both die. Lazarus finds himself in heaven; the rich man in the netherworld. The rich man asks for assistance from Lazarus in his torment. But Abraham reminds the rich man of the good things he had in his life and describes the current situation as a reversal of fortunes. The rich man then asks that Lazarus be sent to warn his family, but this is denied with the reminder that Moses and the prophets have warned of judgment for those who neglect the care of the poor.

The first message of this story is to warn us about our attitude to money or wealth. If we love money and do not use it wisely for our well-being and the well-being of others, we will perish like the rich man in the netherworld.

The story of the rich man and Lazarus also demonstrates the importance of the care of the poor and is a reminder to those who would follow Jesus of the unimportance of wealth in the eyes of God. Jesus is not condemning wealth, but our lack of attentiveness to the needs of those around us and our total self-centeredness. If we wall ourselves up into our little house and ignore the needy man at the gate who has absolutely nothing we may end up in the same fate as the rich man.

Another powerful image of this story is the great chasm between the rich man and Lazarus. This chasm was created during the lifetime of the rich man as he ignored the plight of poor Lazarus.

He placed himself far from love, far from caring, far from loving, far from forgiving. The invitation to us today is to bridge this chasm we may have created in whatever way we can: through personal generosity and reaching out to those in need with a loving heart.

Sunday, September 25 is World Day of Migrants and Refugees


