



Reflections from Fr. Matthew

"Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple"

In this week's gospel, Jesus continues to lay out the reality of what it means to follow him. We are reminded the cross is not something to be avoided but embraced. The cross is an image of complete self-gift. Jesus gives himself totally for us through his death on the cross. We, too, are called to share the gift of ourselves. We practice self-gift when we give our time to others, help others in need.

Jesus explains to us, when it comes to making a choice for the Kingdom of God, nothing can get in the way. When Jesus describes "hating" one's father and mother, he is not talking about feelings. Rather, he is emphasizing very strongly that choosing to be a disciple means that everything else—family, money, your own life—must come second. In Matthew's version of this story (Matthew 10:37), Jesus refers not to "hating" father or mother, but to *loving them more* than Jesus. Jesus makes it very clear that being a disciple is not easy. It means to bear one's own cross. We have to be aware of how following Christ will alter our own desires and comfort.

These difficult sayings of Jesus are followed by two brief parables; a person constructing a tower and a king marching into battle, that make an obvious point—don't start what you cannot finish. The foolish man in the first story is a landowner who decides to build a tower, but has no finances to complete it. He lacks foresight and planning. The other man is a king who engages in the serious business of war. He would be a fool not to weigh the possibilities of succeeding with a smaller army than his opponent and try to negotiate for peace rather than engage in war. Both metaphors invite us to plan our life with foresight and strong foundations grounded in faith.

Discipleship is difficult and is something we can commit to only if we are prepared to put the Kingdom of God before everything else. The book of Wisdom in our first reading gets to the heart of the matter Jesus told us in the gospel: "For the deliberations of the mortals are timid, and unsure are our plans". We need to rely on God to take our life's journey to heaven successfully.
