WACO, Texas — The Baylor Bears return to the court Sunday, hosting Tarleton State in an early-season non-conference matchup at the Foster Pavilion.

Baylor, fresh off a victory against Sam Houston, aims to build on its momentum following a shaky start to the season. The Bears opened the year with a blowout loss to Gonzaga but have since rebounded under veteran head coach Scott Drew.

Much of Baylor's early success has come from fresh faces. Five-star recruit VJ Edgecombe has showcased his athleticism, though his shooting beyond the arc remains a work in progress. Miami transfer Norchad Omier has emerged as the team's anchor. Despite being undersized, Omier has dominated the paint, leading Baylor through the first three games.

Veteran guard Kendrick Nunn has also provided a steady presence, particularly with his perimeter shooting. Nunn's ability to knock down three-pointers has helped offset the team's struggles from deep, giving Baylor another weapon as they navigate a challenging early schedule.

In addition, freshman guard Rob Wright has impressed early, showing poise beyond his years. Wright has delivered in key moments, showcasing a knack for making smart decisions and providing crucial scoring off the bench. His playmaking ability adds another layer to Baylor's offense, complementing the team's established and new talents alike.

While the Bears have traditionally relied on perimeter shooting, this year's squad has leaned on its inside game for scoring. Baylor will need that versatility against a Tarleton State team known for its aggressive defense under head coach Billy Gillispie.

The Bears and Texans tip off at 6 p.m. Sunday.
