Our Christmas service featured five meditations centered on the five Advent candles:

- Pastor Chris Allen spoke about hope: "We put our hope in this same real and living God."
- Dave Gritters focused on peace: "Jesus calls us to bring peace into our world."
- Rose Admiraal said of joy, "If we truly allow Christ and His Spirit to live in us, our lives should be overflowing with joy."
- Cindy Gritters emphasized love: "God showed us how much He loved us by coming down to Earth to spend time with us. His physical presence was our gift."
- The final candle lit was the white Christ candle. I spoke of Christ: "He's the One who lights up our world and lights up our lives."
