While in prison, I started attending New Life Bible study on Tuesday afternoons with Pastor Rick and his wife, Rose, and the volunteers. They encouraged me to start attending New Life church services on Thursday evenings once a month, which I did. I began reading my Bible every morning, with several devotional books. This is when *I started to feel Jesus with me*!

In the meantime, my wife, Linda, left our former church where we had been members for 50 years for personal reasons. She was encouraged by several friends to attend church in Coon Rapids. She started to attend church there and was very happy.

When I was released, I was really surprised to be accepted and loved by our church, Coon Rapids United Methodist Church. I believe that our church is one big family. I enjoy being a greeter, putting a smile on your faces and telling you to have a blessed day. My favorite part of the service is Pastor Bobbie's children's time. It's good to see the kids learn about Jesus, especially in the world in which we live now. Thank you to Pastor Bobbie for giving me a chance to share my story. After all this, what I know is that Jesus is with me, has always been with me, and will always be with me. I want everyone to know that. Thank you.

We also thank God for Mike Richmond, the first returning citizen to participate in this fundraiser. Tackling the fourth day of RAGBRAI, Mike rode from Ames to Des Moines and had a great time. Another first-time rider, Erik Kamp, didn't just ride from Des Moines to Tama—he also played the bagpipes with the Turlach Ur Pipe Band in Grinnell's Central Park! Three cyclists completed the 500-mile route from Sioux City to Davenport: Teresa Rens and Scott and Katy Roose.

The fifth day was a great opportunity for Lisa Groenendyk, Keith Van Gent, and Pastor Rick to ride. Lisa reminds us of the three Hs of RAGBRAI: heat, humidity, and hills (Iowa isn't flat!).
