On March 10, we were notified by the Iowa Department of Corrections that all volunteer activities were suspended indefinitely due to the threat of COVID-19.

It was early in the pandemic response, as the first case of the virus was discovered in Iowa on March 8.

For the last few months, we haven't been able to be physically present with our incarcerated brothers in Christ. So how do we continue ministering during this time of separation?

- We've sent two worship DVDs for the men to view in the prison chapel.
- We've also sent two newsletters (similar to this one) to encourage the men.
- We've sent them a case of Easy-to-Read Bibles and a big box of Christian music CDs to lift the men's spirits.
- And of course we continue to pray for them daily. We pray especially for men experiencing loss. It's painful for anyone when a family member passes away. Imagine how difficult it must be during a pandemic, while locked up in prison!

Overall, ministry during this global health crisis has been a huge challenge. Pray for the Spirit to open doors so the Light of Christ may shine inside the prison.

we were on site and setting up the tents. The next few days flew by in a rush of activity. We worked 15- to 18-hour days to get the hospital up and running. By Wednesday, I'd put together the last air conditioner and rushed out the back as the first patient came in the front door. The site was now a hot zone.

Coming from relatively untouched Iowa, I did not understand the levels of fear, anxiety, and hurt in New York City. My perspective soon changed, and I experienced Christ in action. Jesus was present in a city ravaged by this new calamity. Samaritan's Purse brought the compassion, caring, and healing hand of Jesus. One could see the change firsthand. People of different races, religions, incomes, beliefs, and values united to help their neighbors.

God was at work, speaking to me. One of my life verses is Isaiah 41:10. One morning, the field hospital leader stood to read. God told me in advance he was going to read my verse. He started: "Do not fear, for I am with you…"

I needed God's strength, and He knew what we needed to continue on. One night, we were so exhausted, then suddenly we heard a chorus of applause and cowbells. We saw a crowd surrounding our site in Central Park, showing us their thanks. The next night, a man played "Amazing Grace" on bagpipes. There was much donated food, several thank-you notes, and many pictures drawn by grateful children. Once, after a day of flooding, God provided a beautiful rainbow.

The patients we served were so appreciative. When one man was released, he locked eyes with me and said, "I will never forget you." We prayed with patients and staff, and every time a patient was released cowbells would ring loudly. We celebrated both Good Friday and Easter outside in the cold (six feet apart, with masks).

God is still teaching me many things from this experience, as I continue to process how He used me as a small part of this team.
