Start A Community Watch Group


Interested in collaborating with your neighbors

A Tribute to Ray Thorn Alamitos Heights Resident and Friends of Colorado Lagoon Founder

On August 27, 2016, our neighborhood lost a beloved long-time

resident, Ray Thorn. Ray was born on March 20, 1946, in Tooele, Utah, and grew up in Utah. While attending Brigham Young University, he met and married Becky Asher, his life-long love. In 1973, Ray and Becky moved to Long Beach where they had a daughter, Nicole. In 1984, Ray, Becky and Nicole moved to Alamitos Heights. Ray loved Alamitos Heights because of Colorado Lagoon and wanted Nicole to be able to experience nature in her backyard. Nicole is now married to Steve and they have a lovely son, Leif.

Ray, one of the founding members of Friends of Colorado Lagoon, led the lawsuit that successfully fought the first iteration of the Termino Ave Storm Drain project which then proposed to discharge polluted storm water into Colorado Lagoon. As president of FOCL, Ray moved the group's focus from litigation to cooperation, pushing for efforts that have vastly improved the lagoon's water quality and restored its wetland habitat. We have Ray to thank for our now clean and beautiful lagoon.

His master's degree in organizational behavior from BYU led to a career in consulting businesses, government, and education. His avocation was almost any outdoors activity, from skiing to hiking to rollerblading. Many of you probably saw Ray out and about in the neighborhood – rollerblading, walking his dog with Becky, playing Frisbee with his dog at the park, playing with his grandson Leif, or working on his house (he was an amazing handyman). He was friendly and kind and will be so very missed. Our hearts go out to his family and friends. Thank You AHIA Members & 2017 Membership Drive

A BIG thank you to all who continue to support AHIA with your membership renewal. Along with various donations collected at AHIA-sponsored events, membership fees account for approximately 90% of our operating budget. Here is a recap of the 2016 totals:

- 817 addresses in Alamitos Heights. Approximately 42% of residents are AHIA members.
- 347 membership renewals (exceeding goal of 304 renewals by 13% (must have been the cupcakes!).
- 269 returning members from 2015; 28 first-time members; the remaining 50 have been members for 1 or more years since 2012.

In the process of preparing the 2017 budget, we decided to not increase membership dues to accommodate increasing costs of our community events like the picnic, summer concert, and tree lighting. Rather, we are going to concentrate on increasing our membership. We have set a membership goal of 400 renewals. With all your support, we believe this is achievable and will assist in off-setting the cost of events.

Colorado Lagoon Restoration Update

The city is re-sloping portions of the

northern shore to create more intertidal habitat for fish and birds and using that material to raise some subtidal parts of the northern arm to accommodate eelgrass. The footbridge will be extended and made more accessible. A nature trail with benches and interpretive signage from the bridge to 6th St will be built. The bio swale to capture and treat runoff from the golf course will be extended. Non-native trees will be replaced with natives and the upland habitat along the trail and golf course will be restored. The timeline is four months, and if they make good on the schedule the lagoon should re-open mid-January. More info can be found at the FOCL website. www.coloradolagoon.org
