Colorado Lagoon Restoration "Phase 2B" Update



A meeting was held on March 16, 2016 to inform the public on next steps for the restoration of the Colorado Lagoon. City of Long Beach Tidelands Division

staff provided an overview of what has been accomplished at the lagoon so far (Phase 1) and what will be done in the next phase (Phase 2B).

The Colorado Lagoon Phase 2B activities will include:

- Creating shallow subtidal and eelgrass habitat through grading and excavation (eelgrass is a marine plant which provides habitat for juvenile fish);
- Extending the footbridge to span the new subtidal area on the north shore;
- Removing the asphalt road and constructing an ADA-compliant trail beginning at 6th Street;
- Creating a bioswale (natural filtration system) between the golf course and the lagoon;
- Removing non-native trees and plants, and replacing with California native plants; and
- Installing informational kiosks, benches, and log seating.

The work is being done to create, restore, and enhance aquatic resources at the Colorado Lagoon. Part of the work is being done specifically to satisfy the regulatory compensatory mitigation requirements of the Naples seawall project and to comply with the Regional Water Board's "Total Maximum Daily

Load" requirements for sediment and water quality.

City staff reported that the Phase 2B construction is planned to start in September and be completed in December 2016. The lagoon will be closed during construction and a temporary construction fence will be installed around the Lagoon. Unfortunately, for our neighborhood, this also means the Christmas trees will not be out in the Lagoon this year. AHIA is already brain storming alternative "tree lighting ceremony" ideas for this year to replace our usual post-Thanksgiving event.




