This year AHIA received a Port of Long Beach Sponsorship, or grant, for \$1000 towards our Picnic, and it represents 23% of the June 10, 2018 Picnic budget. The AHIA Neighborhood Picnic is one of our four yearly AHIA Community Meetings. It is a great social mixer with food, fun, and games. We also mix in a little business as we vote for our Board of Directors too.

At AHIA's last community meeting we hosted Community Leaders Mayor Garcia, Councilwoman Price and LBPD Commander Herzog. We also heard from Gold Flora, the new operators of the medical marijuana dispensary opening at 5630 E. PCH. It was a big meeting with a large crowd and many voices were heard.

We have made a decision to eliminate our 2018 AHIA summer concert at Marine Stadium. When AHIA started sponsoring concerts in the park, it was to fill a void left when the LB Municipal Band reduced their concert schedule due to their budget cut backs. Now that the LB Municipal Band schedule has expanded, and there is a robust summer concert series, we decided AHIA could step away from this event for now.

AHIA isn't in city governance, but we do have an opportunity to communicate with our elected representatives. Councilwoman Price is an AHIA member and lives in our neighborhood. AHIA supported the Councilwoman's Median Safety Agenda Item at City Council meetings. We look forward to seeing the new ordinance addressing pedestrians standing on medians and creating unsafe driving conditions.

In closing, there is more the AHIA Board does and there is more we could do, however, we need the participation of our neighbors who have the time, temperament, and commitment to support and enhance our founding members' goal of creating a stronger community. #### Neighborhood Watch: Block Captains Needed!



In an effort to make Alamitos
Heights a safer place to live, it would
be great to exchange lists of names,
contact numbers, and/or email addresses to let each other know of
any suspicious activity, or if gates or
garage door have been left open, or
if a family pet has been found. There
are a few groups in our neighborhood that are organized and have
had periodic meetings.

Ideally, if we could have one Block Captain per street to coordinate this effort, it could go smoothly and quickly. As an example, there are three blocks on Terraine between Colorado and 7th Street. I created three lists (one for each block) and enlisted two other volunteers to help complete the lists. Once completed, I'll make a copy for each person on their respective block. I hope in the near future to have a Neighborhood Watch meeting. As a Block Captain, you can decide to do what you feel is best for your street. Creating this list is a small step, but an important one. If you are interested in becoming a Block Captain, I'd be happy to generate a template for you of your block(s) with the addresses or help you with anything else to get your group started. #### Your AHIA Membership Matters



AHIA just completed the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of our 2018 fiscal year. We are grateful for our members who have generously contributed above and beyond the standard membership dues. We have re-

ceived \$885 in donations so far.

As of 4/21 our membership total is 245 households. 28% of the 878 households in Alamitos Heights. Our 2017 membership total was 327 households. As of 4/21 we are 77 members shy of our 2017's membership totals.

Your membership matters to AHIA. Your dues and donations are put to work to add value to our community. For example, the June AHIA picnic is funded by 129 memberships. The November Lagoon Tree Lighting Event is funded by 78 memberships, and AHIA's Communications budget needs 75 members' dues. That means need 282 dues members to break even on three budget items. We are 37 members short. And, this just a part of the AHIA's total budget.

The goal of this article is to let our Alamitos Heights neighbors know we value and appreciate them and need your support by joining AHIA.
