 - Perform duties assigned by the Board of Directors










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

- Things To Remember
 - When in need of support, Contact the Youth State Leadership
 - State Issues and Priority Campaigns
 - State Call Schedule
 - Unit Check-ins with State Conference President
 - State Group Messages
 - Quarterly Meeting Schedules
 - State Convention (August- December)

INTERNAL COMMUNICATION UNIT MEMBERS

- Have an active group message that is frequently used for news, updates and promotion
- Schedule at least two Executive Committee meetings to discuss campaigns/programs
- Revisit roles, responsibilities, and what that looks like to execute unit goals
- Schedule Consistent Check-Ins between Unit Advisor & Executive Committee
- Share the Executive Committee Meeting report
- Have at least one general body meeting per month

- Have an active unit email address that is frequently checked

- Be Present and build community (Fall)

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


