The Founding of the NAACP

On February 12, 1909, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People was founded by a multiracial group of activists, who answered "The Call," in New York City NY. They initially called themselves the National Negro Committee.

Founders

Ida Wells-Barnetts, W.E.B. DuBois, Henry Moscowitz, Mary White Orvington, Oswald Garrison Villiam, William English Walling, leading "The Call", renewing the struggle for civil and political liberty.

NAACP Mission

The mission of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People is to ensure the political, educational, social, and economic equality of rights of all persons and to eliminate race-based discrimination.

NAACP Vision Statement

The vision of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People is to ensure a society in which all individuals have equal rights without discrimination based on race.

The Dayton Chapter of the NAACP was established on February 9, 1915 at Zion Baptist Church. The Dayton Chapter NAACP was Officially Chartered by the NAACP Board of Directors on May 10, 1915. During that year, the chapter had 75 members. Its primary objective that year was to stop the attempt of segregation in Dayton Public Schools. That year, the chapter raised \$96 in order to further its work.


During the 100th Anniversary of the NAACP, the Association celebrated the 60 distinguished pioneers who signed the Lincoln Day Call which led to the founding of the Association on February 12, 1909.

Among the Founders, pictured on this page, were Oswald Garrison Villard, who wrote The Call; Ida Wells-Barnett, a crusader against lynching; William English Walling, whose article on the Springfield, Illinois race riots of August 1908, stressed the need for a "large and powerful body of citizens" to defend the rights of black people. Henry Moskowitz, a social worker among immigrants, W.E.B. DuBois, the multi-talented founder and first auditor of The Crisis, Mary White Ovington, a social worker, who conceived the idea for an NAACP, Moorefield Storey, the NAACP's first president and John Haynes Holmes, a minister.







Among the Founders, pictured on this page, were Frederick Rike, Co-Owner of Rike's Department Store; Louise Troy, the only African American Teacher Retained after schools were integrated in 1887; Julia Shaw Patterson Carnell, wealthy caucasian and philanthropist; Willard Chamberlin, caucasian businessman; Rabbi David Lefkowitz, leading Jewish leader; Dr. B. A. Rose; and Moses Jones, leading Colored Lawyer in entire State of Ohio.

I want to publicly thank our Officers, Standing and Special Committee Chairs, and Volunteer Staff for the exemplary work you have accomplished. During these lingering unprecedented Coronavirus COVID-19 Pandemic times, you rose to the challenge in an excellent fashion. You didn't tuck your tale and go home, you continued to stay on the front lines of justice and give all you got for the betterment of the Dayton Region. "Teamwork Makes the Dream Work."

Our membership continues to grow, up 0.23% versus the previous year. We ended the year of 2021 as the 2nd largest Unit in the State of Ohio, only behind Cleveland. Our online activists have grown to an impressive 5,792 Facebook Fans (Dayton Unit NAACP) which is up 1.01% versus previous year. Our goal is to have more than 10,000 online activists by December 31, 2021. Become our friend and follow us on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram so we can keep you updated on the latest advocacy work coming from our office. Ask your network of friends to follow us as well, so they are informed of our work too. We introduced the Lorenzo "Mr. Ren" Harris Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000, which means that we provided 6 scholarships to deserving students throughout the Dayton Region, totaling \$6,500. We educated 5,095 Citizens during our 11 Monthly Community Meetings, highlighting topics such as: Survival Skills for Social Media in our Politically-Charged Culture; An Overview of National, State and Local NAACP Sustainability Initiatives; How Youth and Young Adults Rise Above Pandemic Times; Community Centered Policing: A Force For Change; Preplanning and Burial Services; What's The Buzz? Medical Marijuana in Ohio: Facts vs. Fiction; Economic Development Strategy 2022 and Beyond; Keep The Education Promise; Meet Your Candidates; Do You Live Next Door to an Abandoned House; Disability Service Connections for our veterans; and other areas of interest. Additionally, we educated 123 Citizens during our highly educational 2021 Annual Meeting. Our Criminal Justice Committee investigated 37 cases, while our Labor and Industry Committee investigated 106 cases, totaling 143 cases investigated in the year of 2021, up 58.88% versus the previous year. In addition, we addressed 97 inquiries without a formal investigation.

It was truly a blessing to have all of our youth programs fully functioning, and financially and membership compliant, both Statewide and Nationally with the NAACP. The Littlejohn Junior Youth Council, Dayton Youth Council, Move Foward Thurgood Marshall High School Chapter and the Dayton ACT-SO Youth Program, all continue to make positive impacts throughout the Dayton Region. Also, I worked with the NAACP National Memberships and Units Committee to reactivate the Central State University NAACP College Chapter. To God be the Glory for what He has done!

Community Coordination Highlights

Moderated Part I and Part II presentations on "Preplanning and Burial Services. The presenter was Dominique Vanzant of West Memory Gardens. The community was informed of the benefits of preplanning and a robust question and answer session followed.

Convened a meeting with area community activists titled "Just Us, For, For Us, By Us. Attendees identified focus areas to address to prevent destructive behaviors in African American communities. Subsequent meetings were held on September 25, and November 6.



Community Coordination Highlights

Participated in a press conference that updated the community on the progress of the Dayton Unit NAACP Criminal Justice Reform and Police Accountability 8-Point Strategy. Representatives from the Montgomery County Police Chiefs Association highlighted the status of implementation by their organization.

Testified to the Ohio Redistricting Commission and emphasized the constitutional obligation of legislators to draw maps that will provide fair, equitable representation of Ohio citizens.




Educating People to Avoid Poverty





Clifford Owensby Case

On October the 10th, Dr. Derrick L. Foward and Clifford Owensby spoke with Dayton Fox 45's Allison Walker. Dr. Derrick L. Foward, President of The Dayton Unit of the NAACP says Owensby filed a formal complaint with them, and that the NAACP is not working closely with Owensby's Cleveland-based attorney James Willis to determine the next steps. When Walker asked Owensby, "As a black man living with a disability in America what went through your mind when this all happened?"

He responded, "This is it, this is how I go out just like every other black man I watched go out on TV and this is my turn.

On September the 30th Mr. Owensby was asked to exit his vehicle during a routine traffic stop. He told police, he was a parapalegic and could not exit the vehicle, he requested a supervisor during the stop. Body camera footage shows officers pulled Owensby from his vehicle by his hair.



Public Safety and Criminal Justice (Game Changer) Con't...

Jack Runser Case

On November 8th, 2020, Jack Runser took legal action against the Dayton Police Department over how he was treated during an arrest. Runser explained he is a deaf man with cerebral palsy and had just finished mowing his lawn. He decided to walk 1.5 miles to the Dollar General to buy coffee grounds because he ran out. He had \$10 and a mask in his pocket. Runser walked down Gettysburg Ave. Dayton Daily News explained that a passing motorist called 911 to report that a man might have disabilities and was walking in the grassy median and wanted someone to make sure he was ok.

Two Dayton Police officers arrive at the Dollar General parking lot. When Runser arrived, the officers attempted to speak to him from behind masks the officers requested to see his ID, he explained he didn't have an ID on him.

The officers thought Runser might be high on meth and decided to handcuff him and place him in the back of their police car. Runser went through terrible pain in the back of the police car because his body moved involuntarily from cerebral palsy, due to the handcuffs restricting his arms.






