Volunteers meet at the nursery every Wednesday and Saturday from 9 to 12 for propagation and to clean up the Garden. Come in and help anytime you can


Tamiami International Orchid Festival

We are very fortunate to have John Budree, recommended by Carlos. Mr Budree is a private collector involved with orchid societies in Broward and will make a presentation covering a basic introduction to orchids, as well as covering cattleyas, paphs, phals, and bulbos.

He will have plants for sale and there will be a raffle.

Orchids, specialists in Brazilian species. He gave a presentation on growing cattleyas, laelias, and dendrobiums in central Florida, discussing the similarities of the biome here to that of one area of Brazil, which has different biomes: the Amazon rainforest, coastal rainforest, central savannah (cerrado, found in the states of Matt Grosso, Matt Grosso do sul, Minas Gerais, Tocantins, and Goiás), Pantanal, an area of large flooded grasslands, also in Matto Grosso, as well as areas of Bolivia and Paraguay.

The Caatinga is semi-arid with tropical vegetation and is entirely within the tropical zone. It is the only exclusively Brazilian biome, meaning that much of its biological heritage is not found anywhere else on the planet. It is located in the northeast of the country.

In the drier areas of the central desert, there are very few wild orchids and most Brazilian orchids grow in either the Amazonian rainforest and the coastal rainforest.


Other Matters
