The first meeting in 2025 of the KWOS will be back at West Martello. Our speaker will be Jason Downing, PhD, of Fairchild Tropical Gardens, and Director of the Million Orchid Project.

This project is well underway at Fairchild, including a converted school bus, which has been made into a traveling orchid lab. A STEM project, it goes to various schools, demonstrating to students the propagation of orchids, and its aim is to return a million Florida and Caribbean basin orchids to compatible habitats in South Florida.

Currently, our joint project with the Key West Tropical Forest and Botanic Gardens is in its nascent stage, but with over 1000 seedings of native South Florida/Caribbean

Basin orchids growing at Fairchild, it bodes well for the future ability for these seedlings to be planted into their native habitat, thus ensuring their continued existence.

December Meeting

Lynn Bentley-Kemp, PhD, retired professor of photography at the University of Rochester, and latterly at the College of the Florida Keys was our speaker. She started out in analogue photography, using film and SLR cameras, noting that digital photography was much easier, in that entire rolls of film were no longer necessary, although she uses both in her work today.

She gave us many tips for orchid photography, but that the most important were the quality of the light, the focus or sharpness, and the composition or design of the shot. The use of backlighting can provide so many additional variations, that it would take a photographical encyclopaedia to list them all.

Dr Bentley-Kemp now uses an iPhone 15 and noted different apps available in adding drama to photographs. She demonstrated composite photographs that she created with layout applications, using different photos in quadrants, then using an overlay of the main photo.

Some of the apps she recommends are Snapseed, Histagram, Juxtaposer, and Layout. All these apps are available for the iPhone but require work to learn to use them properly. Even so, the iPhone alone has great range, but again one must learn to use them. Yes, it is point and shoot, but for outstanding photos, you must do your homework.

As for the members' plants, Dr Bentley-Kemp's first choice as a species was Jay Pfahl's New Guinea dendrobium, while Pam Van Soest's cattleya was the best hybrid. But the member's choice was Kitty Somerville's Bc Mary Dodson (C Schilleriana x B nodosa).

Asked about the best possible equipment for orchid photography, the answer is, as always, the one you have with you.

After the meeting, members first chose their Christmas gift plants, and then enjoyed a sandwich and salad lunch from Goldman's Deli in the gazebo outside the chapel.
