Rules:

1. All local rules apply pertaining to this department.
2. There will be a place provided for you to arrange your flowers before entering them.
3. Containers for cut flowers will be provided.
4. If less than five (5) entries in a class, the Fair reserves the right to combine classes.
5. Risers, ground cover (humus, rock, chips) will NOT be provided by the fair.
6. Booth space will be allocated by the Building Supervisors after online entry deadline.
7. According to Section 13119 of the Health and Safety Code of the State, it is unlawful to decorate booths with any flammable material unless treated by a flame-retardant chemical as defined in Section 13115. There are many decoration materials on the market today that comply with the letter of the law.
8. All State Rules pertaining to this department apply.
9. Scorecard strictly enforced by judge. **Note:** Exhibits in the Floriculture Department must have been grown by the Exhibitor within the county of Kings, district or community represented by the Exhibitor, except classes for arrangements. Florists and nurseries may exhibit plants, plant material and flowers which they currently sell but do not necessarily grow. Only persons licensed to sell nursery stock may sell plant materials which have been incorporated in displays. **EXHIBITS MUST BE ADEQUATELY AND CORRECTLY LABELED AND THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EXHIBITOR, BEFORE JUDGING.** The judge will use the American system of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th or 5th place according to merit; and if without merit, the judge shall make no award under any circumstances. This rule applies whether there are one or more entries in the class.

SCORECARD:

USE OF FLORICULTURE/ HORTICULTURE:
25% Must use floriculture (plants, flowers, fruits/vegetables, or agricultural commodities in the exhibit.

EDUCATIONAL VALUE - 25% Informative value through the use of signage, labeling, legends and/or any other manner in which information is conveyed to the public.

INGENUITY – 20% Cleverness and skill in design and/or contrivances used to illustrate or represent (such as characters, miniatures, photographs, models, etc.)

ATTRACTIVENESS - 10% Effective use of composition, animation, color and/or other exhibit aids to enhance appearance create interest and invite closer inspection.

LIGHTING - 10% Added dramatic effects, color and/or techniques enhancing the exhibit.

EXHIBIT THEME - 10% Thought or idea expressed by design or feature of the exhibit, i.e.: fair theme, city characteristics, etc.

COMPANY OR GROUP FEATURE BOOTH

Booth Set-Up: Wednesday, June 5, 2024, 10am to 6pm – Monday, June 10, 2024, 10am to 6pm. Company/Group Booths MUST display an agricultural product, process or service of the area represented in such a manner as to inform the public of the value, desirability and interest of the consumer, producer, and community most attractively to be found in the agricultural subject being featured.

BONSAI ART

Open To Surrounding Counties

Rules:

1. Exhibitors are limited to 3 entries per class with a maximum total of **(9)** entries.
2. ORIGINAL and ACQUIRED bonsai are accepted. All bonsai must be the sole property of the exhibitor. If ORIGINAL, no limits as to the creation are applicable to the artist. If ACQUIRED, the exhibitor must be able to show proof of ownership for a minimum of two (2) years. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide maintenance of their tree(s). ACQUIRED bonsai must be identified as such on the entry form. Entries that are not identified as to original or acquired will be assumed to be acquired.
3. Entries shall be identified by species of plant (botanical and common name) the age of the tree, (estimates are acceptable if exact age is unknown) and the bonsai style the artist determines the tree to be. In instances of a combination style bonsai the exhibitor must identify a single style for placement in a class. If a question arises regarding the appropriate class placement for particular bonsai, management shall have the right to assign the entry to a class.
4. Bonsai previously exhibited are allowed to return with the following exception: Bonsai that have won A Best of Show may not be entered to be judged for a period of three years following

the year they won. Bonsai that have won a FIRST may not return to be judged for a period of two years following the year they won. Artists are encouraged to display past years' winners in a special position of merit within the bonsai area.

5. The judges shall have the authority to transfer to the correct section or class any exhibit which is deemed to be entered incorrectly or in the judge's opinion should be transferred to another class or section. Judges shall also have the option of combining classes of exhibits if it is determined that there are insufficient entries in a particular class to offer competition. Should classes be combined, they shall be combined as follows: Broom styles and Cascade styles shall be combined with the Single Trunk Glass, Group and Forest styles shall be combined with the Multiple Trunk Class. Rock Plantings, Shobin, Windswept and other styles may be combined with any appropriate Class at the judge's discretion. They shall be awarded **Best of Show** in Open Bonsai Art and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd per class according to merit and if without merit, no award shall be made. This rule applies to whether there are one or more entries. In the instance where bonsai in a particular class are considered by the judges to be of equal merit, preference shall be given to the original work.

6. **SALE OF EXHIBITS:** If your entry is for sale, **LIST SALE PRICE** when asked. If your entry is **NOT FOR SALE**, indicate by writing **NFS** in the field. All sales inquiries will be referred directly to the exhibitor.

7. Exhibitors found in violation of the rules or in practices unethical or inimical with the Fair program shall be penalized for forfeiture of any awards and or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances.

8. Entries must be in place by Monday, June 10th, 6pm and remain on display for the duration of the Fair.

9. **NOVICE:** One who has not displayed a bonsai at any judged venue and has less than two years' experience within the art. Only original work is allowed.
