JUNIOR LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT

State rules apply where local rules offer no definition.

All entries are due on or before Friday, May 30, 2025 by 12:00 midnight (online only)

An Exhibitor found in violation of established local or state rules is subject to disciplinary action deemed appropriate by The Board of Directors and/or Management of The Kings Fair.

The Kings Fair has established rules for show attire for all livestock exhibitors. Refer to individual exhibitor section for attire. No exhibitor will be allowed to show or exhibit wearing blue jeans, open toed shoes, or tee shirts. Shirts/blouses must have a collar. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not allowed.

FFA CHAPTER MEMBERS

FFA members in good standing are entitled to compete in the FFA department for one calendar year following the year in which they graduate from high school.

Show Attire: All FFA Exhibitors of livestock must wear the official show uniform while showing their animals, which shall consist of FFA Jacket or shirt emblem (unless deemed by fair management to be too hot), tie/scarf, white pants, white shirt, belt and closed toed shoes. All shirts/blouses must have a collar. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not allowed. Hats and/or head gear of any kind SHALL NOT be worn with official show uniform.

4-H CLUB MEMBERS

4-H club members must be 9 years old on or before December 31, 2024. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.

Primary level members who are 5 to 8 years of age on or before December 31, 2024, are not eligible to compete in large animal competitions. Primary members may exhibit poultry, rabbits, and pygmy goats. Primary members do not have to complete YQCA certification.

Primary members may exhibit, however they may not be judged and are ineligible to participate in the sale.

Show Attire: 4-H Club members must wear the King's Fair 4-H uniform while showing their animals. These uniforms consist of 4-H cap worn on head, white pants, white shirt, and tie/collar, belt and closed toed shoes. All shirts/blouses must have a collar. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not allowed.

4-H Club projects must be regularly entered in the records of the 4-H extension service 60 days prior to the opening date of fair. Market steer projects must be entered 120 days prior to the opening date of fair.

INDEPENDENT JUNIOR EXHIBITORS

Independent Exhibitors, 9 to 17 years of age as of December 31, 2024 (for the Kings Fair) may enter 4-H or FFA Divisions, or Independent Divisions where available. Independent exhibitors must bring in original documents for proof of age. (Birth Certificate, Driver's License, California ID Card.) Exhibitors who are 14 years and younger as of December 31, 2024, will enter in 4-H divisions and exhibitors 15 years and older as of December 31, 2024, will enter in FFA divisions.

Show Attire: Must wear white pants, white shirt, belt and closed toed shoes when showing livestock. All shirts/blouses must have a collar. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not allowed.

To exhibit livestock, independent junior exhibitors must not have been in a junior organization within 30 days prior to fair (60 days for market animals other than beef; 120 days for market beef cattle and dairy replacement cattle) to be eligible to participate. A competent adult must supervise independent exhibitors while on grounds.

LOCAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- All State Rules published by the California Department of Food & Agriculture; Division of Fairs & Expositions are in force for the Kings Fair. Copies of the State Rules are available online at 2025 State Rules for California Fairs.
- 2) California Department of Food and Agriculture requires all livestock exhibitors to complete the youth quality assurance certification program. This is a web-based program each exhibitor can do at home. Visit www.kingsfair.com to use the link to register and complete certification. Proof of completion will be required with entry submission. You will need to upload your certificate with your entries. Cavy, Dog, Pygmy and Primary Members DO NOT need to complete YQCA certification.
- 3) If an exhibitor has any outstanding balance for fees they will not be eligible for show at the 2025 Kings Fair.
- 4) Premium checks will be mailed following the show. Checks must be cashed within 90 days of issue to remain valid. A \$40.00 fee will be charged for expired checks to be reissued from either the Fair or the livestock auctions. Requests for a check to be reissued after 13 months will be denied. Any unpaid exhibitor balances will be withheld from premium or

market checks. No Refunds will be made, be sure to review entries carefully before submitting.

- 5) All classes will be judged under the American System unless otherwise stated.
- 6) Fair management is not responsible for errors in entries. No exhibitor shall be entitled to an award that has been disallowed as the result of his/her own error.
- 7) Livestock entries must be completed online and are due no later than 12:00 midnight, Friday, May 30, 2025. No paper entries will be accepted. Fair office will be open from 9 am to 6 pm on May 30, 2025, to answer any questions.
- 8) Unless otherwise specified, only residents of Kings County or members in good standing of Kings County 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters or Grange Organizations may exhibit at the Kings Fair, unless otherwise specified.
- 9) Independent & Grange animal exhibitors may exhibit at age 9 as of January 1 & through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age (per CA State Rules). Independents shall enter 4-H or FFA classes as follows:
 - a. Independent Junior exhibitors who are 13 years of age or under shall compete in the appropriate 4-H divisions only.
 - b. Independent Junior exhibitors who are 14 years of age or older shall compete in the appropriate FFA divisions only.
- 10) PLEASE NOTE: Independent exhibitors must provide proof of age (i.e.: Birth Certificate, Driver's License, California ID Card). READ STATE RULES CAREFULLY REGARDING RULES, QUALIFICATIONS AND DEADLINES PERTAINING TO INDEPENDENT EXHIBITORS.
- 11) For classes that combine 4-H, FFA, Grange and Independent Junior animals, the judge will designate only one overall highest placing animal, i.e., Champion or Reserve Champion, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex.
- 12) All awards will be awarded at time of judging.
- 13) The judge's decision on awards cannot be protested. Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules. All protests must be presented to Management of the Fair in writing within 24 hours of the alleged violation and must be accompanied by a \$100.00 deposit (cash, money order, or certified check), or \$500.00 if the protest relates to a violation of State Rules X-XI, which will be returned if the protest is determined valid. Protests and appropriate action are decided by the Fair Management/Fair Board of Directors. If protests cannot be resolved with the Board of Directors, the Division of Fairs and Expositions may intervene.
- 14) Exhibitors are required to keep pens clean during the fair.
- **15**) If fair ear tags are removed from market animals during fair the exhibitor and the exhibitor's organization will be assessed a \$100.00 penalty fee per head. Your ear tag is not a souvenir!
- 16) Grange/Independent exhibitors will show in their respective shows.
- **17**) If any animal is deemed dangerous or unsafe in any way, Fair Management reserves the right to require the exhibitor to remove the animal from the fairgrounds immediately.
- **18**) Prior year's Round Robin winners are eligible to compete in showmanship classes and future Round Robin Divisions as often as they win eligibility.
- **19**) Primary members may exhibit, however, may not be judged and are ineligible to participate in the sale.
- 20) All market animals must be contracted to show at the Kings Fair. Contracts for

market beef are due February 19, 2025. Contracts for market swine, sheep, goats, and prospect steer projects are due April 21, 2025. There is no limit on the number of animals you may contract. There are entry limitations addressed within the species department in the book.

- 21) If, after an animal has been contracted and you need to replace the animal due to death or broken limb you must notify the Fair Manager immediately and that animal must be inspected by a fair official. In the case of market beef, replacement must be no closer to the Fair than 120 days. Replacement of rabbit and poultry must be no closer to Fair than 30 days. For all other market animals' placement must occur no closer than 60 days prior to the fair.
- **22**) Radios, bikes, skateboards, and scooters are not allowed on the fairgrounds. No picnic tables or lawn chairs will be allowed in the aisles. AISLES MUST BE KEPT CLEAR & CLEAN.
- **23**) NO BBQ'S are allowed on the fairgrounds. If a BBQ is brought on to the grounds, fair management will confiscate and tag the BBQ. Owners can claim and pick the BBQ up the Sunday at the close of fair, but not before.
- 24) NO Porta coolers are allowed on the fairground. If a porta cooler is brought on the grounds fair management will confiscate and tag the cooler. Owner can claim and pick the cooler up Sunday at the close of fair but not before.
- **25**) No easy-ups or tents under the barn, no exceptions. All easy-up must be no larger than 12x12 and be flame-retardant with the California issued tag on the easy-up. If the tag is not on the easy-up it will be removed from the premises. There will be no more than four (4) easy-up in a row with a twelve foot (12') space in between the fourth (4th) easy-up. All easy-up and tack space will be assigned by club and chapter each club and chapter will receive one 12'x12' space per specie as space permits and spaces will be clearly marked.
- 26) Pad Locks are not to be used on pen gates; locks will be removed at exhibitor's expense.
- 27) STALL REQUESTS: Due to limited barn space Fair Management does not guarantee stall requests. All tack must be kept out of access aisles. Exhibitors or leaders found to be entering animals solely for the purpose of obtaining extra stall space will not be entitled to that stall space or a refund of any fees.
- **28)** Registration papers on registered animals must be verified by livestock management on Wednesday, June 18, 2025, before 7 PM.
- **29**) Exhibitor must declare market animals to show and sell during the Kings Fair with a Market Contract.
- **30**) Only animals entered in the show may be on fairgrounds. Unless verified otherwise by management.
- 31) Club and Chapter Groups may be entered in Livestock office before Wednesday, June 17th at 5pm.
- **32)** Reasonable precaution will be taken in protection of exhibits; the Kings Fair will not be responsible for loss, damage, or theft, whatever the cause.
- 33) The livestock office will be open starting Monday, June 16, 2025. Barn assignments will be posted by Noon, June 16, 2025. Tents & easy ups may not block driveways or unloading zones and must be 20 feet from any barns and/or buildings. Anyone that blocks driveways or unloading zones along with areas not designated for tents or easy-ups will have their easy-ups or equipment removed and must be picked up from livestock office. No BBQ's

allowed on the grounds. We suggest you wait until security is in place (Tuesday, June 17th) to begin work on your display area. Security will be located in the Livestock Barn Area.

- 34) Poultry arrives Thursday, June 19th between 7 am 9 am. All poultry must go through poultry inspection in livestock parking lot A. All birds will need a coop in slip signed by the poultry inspector. No poultry will be allowed on the grounds unless they have been inspected.
- **35**) All other Market Animals must be on fairgrounds by Wednesday, June 18th, 2025, at 5:00pm.
- **36**) REPLACEMENT HEIFERS MUST BE IN PLACE BY WEDNESDAY, JUNE 18TH, 5:00 pm. Inspection will begin at 5 pm in the Dairy Ring. All Replacement Heifers must be inspected by 5:30 pm. Brand papers must be present during the inspection.
- **37**) Animals will be weighed once, electronically. If there is a disagreement regarding the weight, the animal will be removed from the scale, the scale zeroed, and the animal will be re-weighed. This weight will become the official weight. The animal will not be allowed to leave the scale area. Animals failing to meet the required minimum weights will be classified as feeders and allowed to show in a feeder class. There will be only one class of feeders for each species; all organizations combined. Underweight animals are not eligible to sell at auction.
- 38) Overweight Animals: Animals exceeding the stated top weights are not eligible for sale but will be allowed to show in showmanship and entered into a super-heavyweight division. Super-Heavyweight will not be allowed to compete for champion or sell.
- 39) Livestock A Parking Lot Permits will be Buyers Parking ONLY on Saturday, June 21, 2025, until 2pm. NO LIVESTOCK A Parking PASSES will be accepted in this lot until 2pm. Livestock A Passes will be excepted at main fair parking lot. You can purchase Livestock A Parking Permits on the Fair Website.
- **40**) Any person who copies their pass(es) or allows them to be copied will be disqualified from the show immediately. Any awards earned or sales made will be cancelled and exhibitor must remove animals from the grounds, surrender their passes and will not be allowed back into the livestock area.
- **41**) No alcoholic beverages may be brought onto the fairgrounds, in coolers, ice chests, automobiles, tack and semen tanks etc. These items will be searched.
- **42**) FIRST BEDDING will not be provided. Sheep, Hogs and Goats are to be bedded with shavings; Cattle exhibitors may use shavings or straw.
- **43**) BARN DECORATIONS & DISPLAYS must be designed to allow movement of air through the barn. Solid backdrops are prohibited. (Nothing more than 36" above the top pen panel is acceptable in Hog & Sheep barns).
- 44) RED TAGGING will occur if stalls and pens are not kept neat and supplied with necessary clean bedding. Pathways must be kept clean for the convenience of spectators. Anyone not keeping their section of the barn clean and neat may be expelled from the Fair and no awards/sale proceeds will be made to the offender. The Fair will provide staff and equipment to remove waste from the stockpile areas. All exhibitors must bring waste to these specified areas. Exhibitors either not taking care of their animals or having stalls that do not meet the 'clean'

criteria will be RED TAGGED. EXHIBITORS RECEIVING A 'RED TAG' ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR OUTSTANDING EXHIBITOR. Management will inspect the barns daily and "RED TAG" pens or stalls found in unsanitary condition. Any exhibitor receiving a second "RED TAG" will forfeit any awards earned. A third "RED TAG" will require exhibitor to remove the animal(s) from the grounds, forfeiture of awards and exhibitor's pass. If exhibitor has already sold the animal the sale will be VOIDED, and exhibitor will be held responsible for any fees and/or processing charges.

- **45**) Fitting, handling & showing of animals: once an animal is entered in the junior livestock show and arrives on the fairgrounds, all junior show exhibitors must be actively involved and shall care for, fit, groom, and wash their own animal.
- **46**) Animal Care & Ethics-Refer to Code of Ethics adopted by KINGS FAIR, CALIFORNIA STATE 4-H, CALIFORNIA FFA ASSOCIATION, CALIFORNIA STATE GRANGE, WESTERN FAIRS ASSOCIATION, AS WELL AS OTHER AGRICULTURAL ORGANIZATIONS, signed by the Exhibitor, Parent/Guardian and Leader/Advisor at the time you turned in your contract. your contract. 2025 Kings Fair Code of Ethics Form.pdf
- **47**) Night Hawks are allowed for evening care of large animals. Night Hawks are not allowed to wash, groom, fit any animal on the fairgrounds or tamper with animals other than the ones permitted by owner. Night Hawk must be over the age of 21 and may NOT BE AN EXHIBITOR. Night Hawk must remove themselves from fairgrounds prior to 7am and night hawks vehicles are not permitted on the fairgrounds. If violated Night Hawk, Exhibitor, and livestock are subject to disqualification by Management and/or Livestock Superintendent. A decision by the Livestock Superintendent to disqualify an exhibitor for violation of this rule shall be final and shall not be subject to protest.
- **48**) You have until 12pm Friday to declare which market animal you wish to sell or to pull your animal from the auction. Show Management will declare the highest placing animal for the exhibitor if the exhibitor fails to follow this rule.
- **49**) RELEASE OF ANIMALS and TACK: See Livestock schedule for animal and tack release information. Animals left on the grounds after 3 pm on Monday, June 23, 2025, will be charged stall fees at a rate of \$50 per head per day charged to the exhibitors JLA check.
- **50**) SALE CHECKS: The Fair Office will notify Advisors and Club Leaders when checks are eligible for pickup. You will receive one check in 2025 that includes the sale of your animal and your add-ons. Add-ons at the Kings Fair will close Monday, June 22, 2025, so we can collect all buyers payments and disburse payment to you as quickly as possible.
- **51**) All Livestock exhibitors selling a market animal must be invoice runners during the Jr. Livestock Auction on Saturday June 21, 2025. If any exhibitor does not show up to be an invoice runner there will be a \$50.00 fine held from JLA check. Make sure to sign the sign-in sheet.
- 52) All livestock classes must have 5 exhibitors entered in order to hold competition. If
- **53**) less than 5 exhibitors are entered in a class show management will combine class in AOB or will combine with appropriate market class.

SALE ENTRY LIMITATIONS

Exhibitors are allowed to enter multiple market animals, replacement heifers and yearling heifers into the fair prior to the entry deadline as long as they have been contracted by the state ownership requirement date set forth by the fair. Exhibitors must declare which two market animals will be present before Tuesday, June 17, 2025. Exhibitors **WILL BE** allowed to sell one (1) Market animal **AND** one (1) Breeding animal.

Exhibitors showing and/or selling an animal through the Kings Fair Dairy Sale or the Junior Livestock Auction are required to be present in the arena at the time of the show and sale. Violations of this rule will result in the following:

- 1) a penalty-fee deduction of 25% from the net sale price of the animal; and
- 2) A <u>one (1) year suspension</u> from all activities (including showing and selling of animals, etc.) at the Kings Fair for each offending exhibitor.

<u>Exception</u>: if an exhibitor has two (2) or more animals in the same class another exhibitor may show one of the animals. If an exhibitor is unable to show his/her own animal(s) due to a medical reason or a school related absence, the exhibitor must submit a signed letter by the exhibitor and doctor, or school principal and it must be approved by the Fair Manager. All letters must be submitted to Fair Office.

<u>NO SOLICITING OF BUYERS PRIOR & DURING AUCTION ON</u> <u>FAIRGROUNDS! (i.e., no "for sale" signs)</u>

RULES

- 1. Market animals placing Market Ready or Market Acceptable are eligible to sell.
 - 1. All Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion animals from each species (sheep, beef, swine & goats) are terminal and must

be shipped by fair staff from the fairgrounds directly to the fairs processing facility (i.e., they may not be picked up live or donated to a barbeque). Rabbit, and poultry Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champions are not terminal. Rabbits will go live to be picked up and processed by the exhibitor. Poultry may go live or custom. Custom poultry buyers will be contacted once their animal are ready for pick-up

- 2. All animals must be healthy and moving soundly in order to go through the sale.
- 3. ALL Animals must sell in order as listed in the Official Sale Book. Any exhibitor that misses their assigned sale order will receive resale value after fees are deducted.
- 4. Exhibitor is obligated to sell his or her animal to the highest bidder unless it is withdrawn in writing to the livestock office 24 hours prior to the start of the sale. Exhibitor further acknowledges that if their animal is awarded Supreme Champion or Reserve Supreme Champion, it cannot be withdrawn from the sale under any circumstances, and the sale of that animal will be terminal unless they are selling a Dairy Replacement Heifer, Dairy Yearling Heifer, or Commercial Beef Replacement Heifer.
- 5. No changes (buyer number, disposition, etc.) Will be accepted on the sales invoice after it has been completed and signed by the buyer or the buyer's agent.
- 6. A sales commission of 8% will be deducted from each sale to defray expenses of the sale. An additional .0045% will be deducted from all market hogs sold (National Pork Board Check-off) and \$2.50 will be deducted from all cattle sold (Beef Council fee and Brand Inspection fees). Fees are subject to change!
- 7. Exhibitors may sell one (1) Dairy Replacement springer, Yearling or Beef Replacement Heifer in Friday's sale and one (1) market animal in Saturday's sale at the 2025 Kings Fair. This includes small animals. Should an exhibitor have two overall supreme/grand or reserve supreme/grand champion market animals and a dairy replacement/yearling heifer, they will be allowed to sell ALL THREE. <u>Exception</u> to this rule: If an exhibitor has a Champion or Reserve Champion small animal and a large animal that is not a Champion the small animal may be pulled in order to sell the large animal. Rabbit, and poultry Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champions are not terminal. This process must be completed by Thursday, June 19, 2025 by noon.
- 8. Trading of lower placed animals for higher placing ones after the sale is forbidden.
- 9. Exhibitors must be 9 years old by December 31, 2024, in order to be eligible to participate in the sale.
- 10. If an animal is purchased by or a sales invoice is signed by a family member of the exhibitor and it results in bad debt, the Fair reserves the right to refuse future entry of any other family members until the balance is cleared. This rule also applies to any add-ons made by a family member.
- 11. All exhibitors are encouraged to secure a buyer for their animal **PRIOR TO THE SALE**.

12. <u>NO SOLICITING OF BUYERS ON FAIRGROUNDS PRIOR OR DURING</u> <u>AUCTION! (i.e., no "for sale" signs)</u>

- 13. Add-on bids will close Monday, June 23, 2025, at 4pm. No exceptions!! \$50.00 minimum.
- 14. Exhibitors that are eligible to sell through the Jr. Livestock sale must be present during sale

to sell their own animal.

- 15. The Kings Fair will not be held liable for the following conditions after the gavel hits and auctioneer declares the animal sold: mastitis, calf mortality, animal mortality, lameness, inability to produce product (meat or milk), or illness. All animals entered into the sale have been examined during the contract period. All Buyers buy at their own risk. The fair will not change price or reimburse buyers for animals that are unable to produce a product.
- 16. Market hogs will only be processed as custom or donation to pork BBQ, no resale option will be available in 2025.

SHOWMANSHIP AWARDS

Limited to Kings County Exhibitors Only!

ONLY animals owned, fitted, and SHOWN by the Exhibitor in Junior Livestock classes are eligible. All Exhibitors will be required to wear the official uniform of the organization they represent. The animal that the exhibitor begins showing in showmanship is the animal with which they must finish.
