Overview

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency will be facilitating a communications focused exercise in preparation for the 2026 Fédération Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) World Cup in Seattle, Washington. The purpose of this exercise is to respond to, manage, and mitigate a simulated attack involving intentional and unintentional radio frequency (RF) interference and cyber attacks simultaneously to disrupt communication capabilities during the World Cup. During this two-day exercise, Amateur Radio Operators, Public Safety Radio Technicians, Dispatchers and special teams from the National Guard, Federal Communications Commission, Federal Emergency Management Agency, and City of Seattle will go through a series of drills to restore operations. During the exercise communication staff within the incident command system will respond to the RF interference and cyber attacks then work with federal, state, local and tribal partners to restore communications using best practices from previous Department of Homeland Security exercises.
