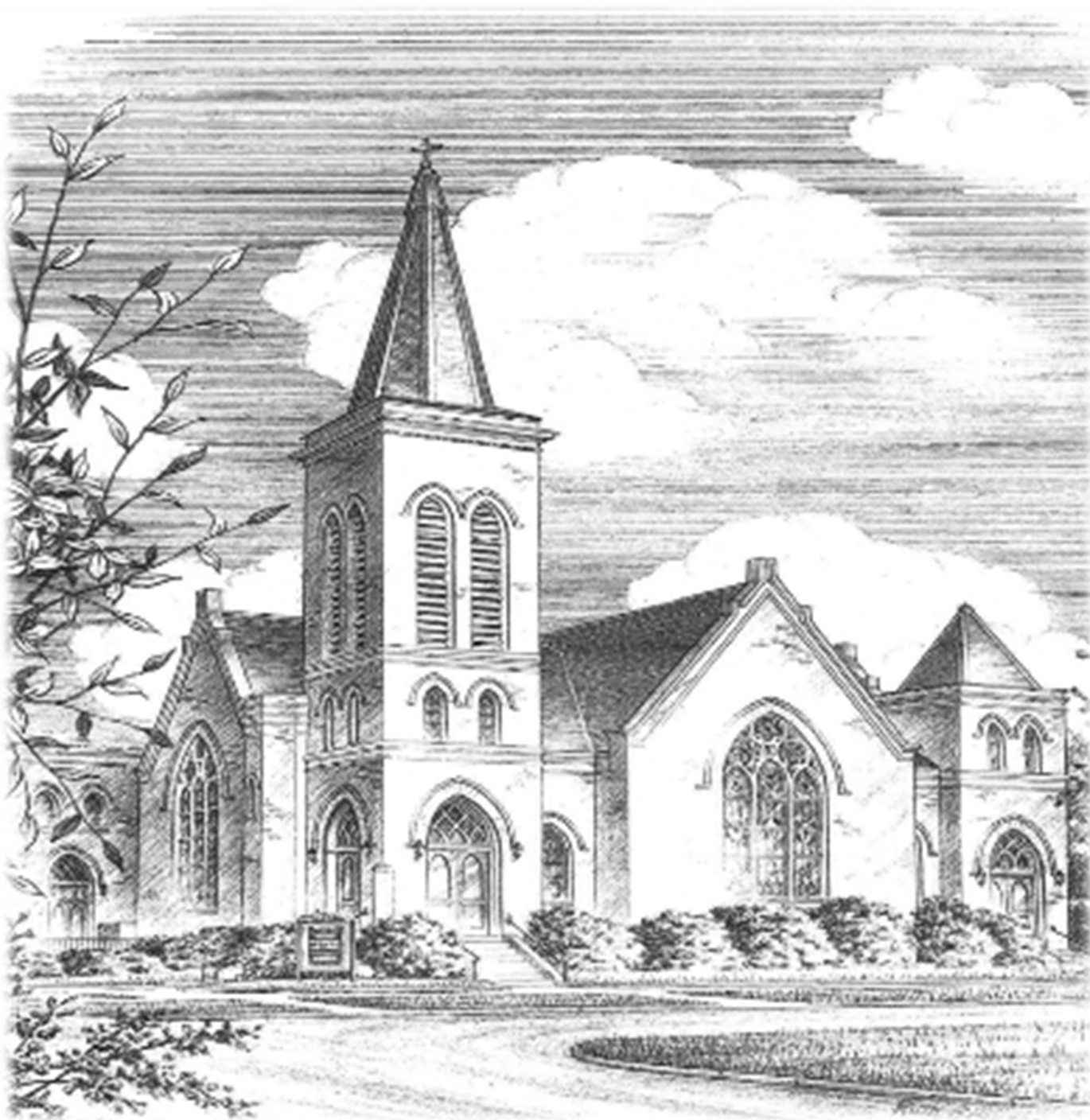

Christmas “In Our Darkness Shines a Light”

Isaiah 9:1-7

I. People are described as those lost in the shadow land of death. vs. 2

Darkness is a metaphor for evil, sin, and death. In the immediate context the Lord identifies the rebellion of the people. There are three charges in chapter 8.

- A.** They have turned from the Lord to human kings for security. **Isaiah 8:6**
- B.** They have rejected God’s Counsel in favor of the counsel of men. **Isaiah 8:19-20**
- C.** They rage against their Maker. **Isaiah 8:21**

II. The Light dawns on this landscape of darkness and death.

On that ancient Christmas morn, the light dawns, heaven’s doors are opened wide. **The light is “a child born to us, a son given to us.”**

2 Corinthians 4:6 For God, who said, “Let light shine out of darkness,” made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.

1 Peter 2:9 But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

III. The dawn brings Joy to those on whom it shines. Vs. 3

When the Son rises he kindles gladness in our hearts. Isaiah grounds that gladness in a threefold FOR

- 1. **vs. 4** - You have shattered the yoke (of slavery) that bound us.
- 2. **vs. 5** – He has ended our war.
- 3. **vs. 6-7** – Christ will dawn as our forever king.

Calvin comments: “under him supreme and everlasting happiness may be enjoyed.”

IV. All this and more Christ fulfilled at his first coming - in part. The full and permanent fulfillment is still to come.

Christ came and will come again but that is not the whole story.

1 Thessalonians 5:5,8-10 You are all sons of the light and sons of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness.⁸ But since we belong to the day, let us be self-controlled, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. ⁹ For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁰ He died for us so that, whether we are alive or dead, we may live together with him.

Isaiah. 9:1-7 Nevertheless, there will be no more gloom for those who were in distress. In the past he humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the future he will honor Galilee of the Gentiles, by the way of the sea, along the Jordan-- ² The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.

³ **You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy;** they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest, as men rejoice when dividing the plunder.

⁴ **For** as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor.

⁵ **For** every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire.

⁶ **For** to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷ Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The **zeal** (an energized, determined resolve) of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this.

Three Charges

Isaiah 8:6 "Because this people has rejected the gently flowing waters of Shiloah and rejoices over Rezin and the son of Remaliah, He will bring the King of Assyria against them. "

Isaiah 8:19-20 "When men tell you to consult mediums and spiritists, who whisper and mutter, should not a people enquire of their God? ²⁰ To the law and to the testimony! If they do not speak according to this word, they have no light of dawn."

Isaiah 8:21 Distressed and hungry, they will roam through the land; when they are famished, they will become enraged and, looking upward, will curse their king and their God.
