Fear Not ('Cause God Said So!) by Katie Damon

I have a bad habit of over-thinking EVERYTHING. So much so that I can become frozen in uncertainty. I can let the fear of not 'getting it perfect" stop me from making decisions. If it's just about what color to paint my dining room, that's not such a big deal. But when it comes to bigger things, over-thinking can become a stumbling block. It's an insecurity I've been working

hard to recognize and overcome in recent years.

A little over a year ago, I noticed this creeping into my faith journey and my life in the church. Not so much my relationship with God, but more in how I process things about church itself. I am not even sure I can really describe this time – I just know it was causing me a little too much anxiety. After a few months, I recognized what I was doing to myself and knew I had to do something. During that time, I prayed and talked (and fussed although it was just one-way) with God. I asked him to give me the courage to stay faithful, to stay connected. And in that time, God calmed my spirit and prepared me for things I wasn't

A verse I am drawn to, Joshua 1:9, says "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." God does not just suggest that we be strong and courageous, He commands it. Not because we always feel

brave, or because we have all the answers, but because He promises His presence. It reminds me I don't have to understand everything perfectly – He does – and I that He is working out all the details, he just needs me to trust Him.

As my church family, I can imagine some of you have maybe felt this same way lately. It is easy to let uncertainty creep in and to become consumed with questions: What will happen next? What will the future look like? Will we be able to move forward together? Just like in my own tendency to overthink, those questions can become paralyzing if we let them. But God is not calling us to stand frozen in fear, He is calling us to move forward in faith.

The truth is, we will not have every answer right away. We may not see the full picture of what God is doing. But what we do have is His promise: that He will not leave us, that He goes ahead of us, and that His strength is made perfect in our weakness. This means we can take each next step with

confidence, not in our own ability, but in His faithfulness. So, as Duncan looks toward the future, let us choose courage over fear and faith over doubt. Let us remember that God has carried this congregation through many seasons before, and He will continue to carry us now. Together, we can be strong and courageous, not because we have all the answers, but because the One who holds the future walks with





Methodist Historical Moment

On February 23, 1785, Reverend Francis Asubury, Reverend Woolman Hickson, Reverend Jesse Lee, and Reverend Henry Willis rode into Georgetown on horseback. Asbury's first visit to Georgetown was nearly a disaster. He didn't want to come to the coast. He doubted he would have any success - for Georgetown had a reputation as a town full of sinners. But - the men had ridden hundreds of miles and spent their traveling money. While the name of the ministers' first host in Georgetown is unknown, journals mention that just as the men were leaving their host's house for preaching, the man excused himself as it was his turn to supervise a ball that night. The ministers were shocked - any kind of dancing was a sin in the Methodist Church. Not only were they broke, but they were also staying in the home of a dancer!

Reverend Jessie Lee prayed that, if the Lord had sent them to such an evil place, he would find them another home in which to stay. After the prayer meeting, Lee felt his prayers were answered when William Wayne introduced himself. He welcomed the ministers to spend the night in his home. Wayne was the nephew of General "Mad Anthony" Wayne of Revolutionary War fame and a local merchant who had moved to South Carolina from Pennsylvania. Wayne was well-known to the Baptist and Episcopalian churches already in Georgetown. They had both refused to make him a member. Wayne was so concerned about his soul that he took to preaching in the streets of town. People thought he was crazy.

The man rejected by other churches became a solid rock foundation for Methodists in Georgetown. Wayne gave the ministers shelter for the night and breakfast the next morning. He showed the preachers to the ferry and paid their passage across the river

While Asbury, Lee, and Willis rode to Charleston, Hickson stayed behind in Georgetown, to start a local church with William Wayne. Two weeks later, Asbury returned through Georgetown on his way north at which time he ordained William Wayne as a local preacher. Hickson stayed behind with Wayne to serve the new Methodist Church in Georgetown.

William Wayne is named as the first Methodist convert in the state and Georgetown is credited with the first Methodist Church in South Carolina, known today as Duncan Memorial Methodist Church.

What do the colors on the altar mean?

The colors you see on the altar and pulpit aren't just decoration, they tell the story of the Church's seasons.

Green is for growth, used in "Ordinary Time" as a reminder of steady faith and discipleship. **Purple** marks seasons of preparation like Advent and Lent and reminds us both of the majesty of Christ the King and the call to prepare our hearts through prayer, repentance, and hope.

White celebrates the high feasts of Christmas, Easter, and special holy days, symbolizing joy and purity.

Red represents the fire of the Holy Spirit, especially on Pentecost, and also honors the sacrifice of martyrs.

Together, these colors mark the rhythm of our Christian journey and keep our worship rooted in the life of Christ. So next time you're in Duncan's sanctuary, take a look around and you'll see the story of faith told in color!
