

The altar flowers in the sanctuary today are given to the glory and honor of God and in loving memory of my father, Bo Tyson, and my son, James Ellerbe, by Velva Ellerbe.

God procures this great Salvation by the shedding of the blood of Christ. The placating of the wrath of God pays the full penalty of the law and I am set free. Vs. 21-25a

- 1. **Propitiation** This death placates, satisfies the Judge and the demands of the law. Every demand and penalty has been paid in full.
- 2. **Justification** Viewing all the evidence in the life of the believer the judge declares sinner righteous not just forgiven but clothed with the righteousness of Christ.
- 3. **Redemption** This death penalty is a ransom that sets free the prisoner. Charles Wesley sums it up in the hymn "And Can It Be."

This process guarantees God's integrity and justice. Vs 25b-26

- 1. **It took care of his forbearance. Vs. 25b** He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished--
- 2. **It enables him to be just and the justifier of those who have faith in Christ. vs. 26** *he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus.*

The characteristic of this great work of Salvation. Vs. 27-31

- 1. It proclaims God's glory.
 - **Vs. <u>27</u>** Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. On what principle? On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith.
 - **Ephesians 1:5-7** In love he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will--to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding.
- 2. It is the divine plan to save all men, both Jew and Gentile.
 - **Vs. 29-30** Is God the God of Jews only? Is he not the God of Gentiles too? Yes, of Gentiles too, since there is only one God, who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through that same faith.
- 3. It upholds the demands of the law
 - vs. 31 Do we, then, nullify the law by this faith? Not at all! Rather, we uphold the law.
