

The Excitement of God on the Move

There's something unmistakably electric happening among us a stirring that whispers, "God is on the move." You can feel it in conversations that carry hope, in prayers that overflow with faith, and in hearts leaning into the rhythm of His will. Like the cloud by day and fire by night that guided the Israelites (Exodus 13:21), the presence of God is leading us with divine purpose, and our Duncan Church Family is being invited to follow with bold steps.

In Isaiah 43:19, God declares, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" That verse beats like a drum in the spirit urging us to stay alert, expectant, and ready to embrace the new work unfolding around us. It's more than a change in routine or a seasonal shift; it's a spiritual awakening.

We see it in the small miracles: in restored relationships, spontaneous generosity, answered prayers, and worship that lifts the roof in praise. When God moves, He repositions people, reorders priorities, and rekindles passion. Maybe that means stepping out of comfort zones to lead a Bible study, serve in a ministry, or reach out to someone in need.

For others, it might mean simply being still and recognizing His voice amid the noise. Remember what Psalm 46:10 reminds us: "Be still, and know that I am God." Sometimes the most powerful response to His movement is quiet trust.

God's movement doesn't always come with fanfare it often arrives in the gentle nudge, the quiet conviction, the sudden courage to forgive, or the patient strength to keep showing up. That's how revival begins: in hearts that are willing to say "yes" before they even know the full question.

Let's be a church that responds. A church that doesn't just admire the movement of God but joins it with holy urgency. That means praying not just for answers, but for alignment with His will. It means welcoming change not with fear, but with faith. And it means loving each other with the kind of grace that only comes from abiding in the Spirit.

The excitement is real. The invitation is clear. God is moving and He's calling the Duncan Church Family not to sit back, but to step forward. Let's move with Him, together.

A Tribute to Warren Sherrer 1942 - 2025



Duncan's Stephen Ministry team would like to pay special tribute to Mr. Warren Sherrer and his contributions to Duncan Methodist Church and especially to the organizing and development of our Stephen Ministry team.

Warren joined Duncan in 2013 transferring from Pawleys Island Presbyterian Church. While at the Presbyterian Church, Warren received training to serve as a Stephen Minister. Through his experience as a Stephen Minister, he saw the value and the importance of a ministry that helped people through difficult and challenging life experiences. Warren, along with the assistance of Susan Church, established our Stephen Ministry at Duncan in 2014. The original class began with 6 trainees. At the present time we still have 8 active Stephen ministers.

Through the years Stephen Ministers at Duncan have worked with over 75 individuals to receive Christian care and support either in a care giver/care receiver relationship or through additional support of sharing books, cards, visits and being present when needed.

If you asked Warren what was the most important thing a Stephen Minister needs to do to help others, his answer was always "LISTEN.... Be that presence in a person's life to show you truly care and are there to offer unconditional, non-judgmental Christian love and support."

We also appreciate Warren's creative contributions to Duncan. If you remember the United Methodist Cross and Flame symbol that was outside the doors at our Orange Street entrance; this was one of his major projects. That was truly a visible addition to the statement of our faith as United Methodists. He and Carolyn made one hundred wooden crosses, along with, the white and purple drapes for them that many of us still place outside our homes during the Lenten/Easter seasons. Warren served on various committees always doing his best to help Duncan be a witness to others.

As long as he was able, Warren was present at Duncan always offering a friendly handshake and a great smile. His care for others touched many lives. We have missed him in the last few years due to his illnesses. Warren will be remembered and appreciated as one who loved the Lord and served well.

Help Needed for September and November

Did you know?

What is the liturgical calendar and why does Duncan follow it?

Christians follow a liturgical calendar to shape the year around Jesus' life: His birth, ministry, death, resurrection, and ascension. More than dates on a page, it gives us a spiritual rhythm distinct from the secular calendar, inviting us into seasons of preparation, celebration, reflection, and growth. By guiding worship and uniting believers worldwide in the same story, the calendar deepens faith, fosters community, and keeps our lives centered on Christ.

The Christian year includes six seasons and four key holy days: Christmas Day, Epiphany, Easter and Pentecost. Christmas Day and Epiphany always fall on the same date each year (Dec. 25 and Jan. 6). While Easter and Pentecost are always celebrated on Sundays, their dates are determined by the lunar calendar. Advent begins the Christian year, and starts on the fourth Sunday before Christmas, typically just after Thanksgiving.

Each holy day marks a transition between seasons, and each season is associated with a liturgical color that symbolizes the spirit of the time. These colors adorn Duncan's sanctuary as a visible reminder of the Church's journey through the Christian year.


