

## The Doctrine of Imputation

### Romans 4

The two highly esteemed Jews show that all men are justified by faith alone.

## A. It sheds great light on the Old Testament.

- ► There is one covenant of grace.
  John 8:56 Your father Abraham rejoiced at the thought of seeing my day; he saw it and was glad.
- ► It corrects misunderstandings about salvation. Philippians 3:3-9 Ephesians 2:8-10

## B. It helps us understand the grounds of justification.

- ► The concept of imputation λογίζομαι to reckon, count, credit, impute. Used 11 times in chapter 4.
- ▶ It is a work solely based on grace.
  - **2 Cor. 5:21** He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.
  - **Romans 5:19** For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous.
  - **1 Corinthians 1:30** It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God--that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption.
  - **1 Peter 3:18** For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive by the Spirit.

**Philippians 3:3-9** For it is we who are the circumcision, we who worship by the Spirit of God, who glory in Christ Jesus, and who put no confidence in the flesh-- though I myself have reasons for such confidence. If anyone else thinks he has reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more:

<sup>5</sup> circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; <sup>6</sup> as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for legalistic righteousness, faultless.

<sup>7</sup> But whatever was to my profit (what a Jew considers profitable to gain heaven) I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. <sup>8</sup> What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish (excrement, rubbish, dregs), that I may gain Christ <sup>9</sup> and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ--the righteousness that comes from God and is by faith.

**Ephesians 2:8-10** For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith--and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-- <sup>9</sup> not by works, so that no- one can boast. <sup>10</sup> For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.
