"Lifestyle of the Rich and Faithful" Revelation 2:8-11

Intro:

- * Talk about the word, "lifestyle" and define it
- * Illustration: "Lifestyles of the Rich and Famous" (tv show)
 Ask, why was that show so popular?
 Because people wanted to get a glimpse into the lifestyle they wish they had
 Do we desire to get a glimpse of the lifesyle (of Smyrna) we need
- * Talk about how the church in Smyrna is on the "big screen" and Jesus is watching He sees the church through His eyes and from His perspective Ask, what does He see?

Transition: He sees the lifestyle (of the entire church) of the rich and faithful:

1. Rich Despite the Poverty:

- A. Though they appeared to lack <u>everything</u>, they lacked <u>nothing</u>! They had everything they needed in Christ
- B. They could have compromised for their physical needs and did not! They did not live a <u>comfortable</u> life, but a <u>conformed</u> life

2. Faithful Despite the Afflictions and Slander:

- A. They could have given in and denied Christ because it was not worth it and did not!
- A. Willing to continue to be poor
- B. Willing to suffer more afflictions and slander
- C. Willing to be imprisoned
- D. Willing to be martyred

3. Because of Their Lifestyle, Jesus Has No Rebuke:

A. Their lifestyle <u>caused</u> their poverty and affliction, but it was their lifetsyle which <u>caused</u> them to keep their focus on the Lord to sustain them, which <u>caused</u> them no rebuke

Their lifestyle kept them from needing rebuke

4. But He Does Have a Warning, Encouragement & Promise:

- A. Don't be afraid about what will happen to you! (warning)
- B. Keep on being faithful, even to the point of death! (warning)
- C. Do these and I will give you the "crown of life" because you will no be hurt by the 2nd death (promise to overcomer)
- D. Because I am the 1st and the last and have overcome death on your behlalf (description of Jesus as it relates to their situation)

 They don't have to fear death because Jesus has overcome
