PROGRAM

The Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) Out-of-School Youth Program assists out-of-school vouth between the ages of 16 -24 by providing the information, training, and resources necessary to be successful on their career or educational pathway towards self-sufficiency.

REQUIREMENTS/ELIGIBILITY

The program is made possible by funding from the U.S. Department of Labor through the Workforce Investment Board as administered by the Saint Louis County Department of Human Services.

Who is Eligible?

Any youth between the ages of 16-24 years of age who are currently not attending any school.

Eliaible Documents

- Social Security Card
- Birth Certificate
- Verification of Citizenship
- Selective Service Registration (males only)
- Proof of Income
- Picture/State Issued ID
- High School Diploma or GED/HiSet*

Meet One or More Program Barriers

- School Dropout
- Should be in school but did not attend the last calendar guarter (Compulsory Attendance)
- Low income, high school graduate who is basic skills deficient or an English language learner
- Subject to the juvenile or adult justice system
- · Homeless, runaway, foster child or aged out of the foster care system
- Pregnant or Parenting
- Individual with a Disability
- Low income individual who needs additional assistance to enter or complete an educational program or to secure/hold employment

* High School Diploma not required.
