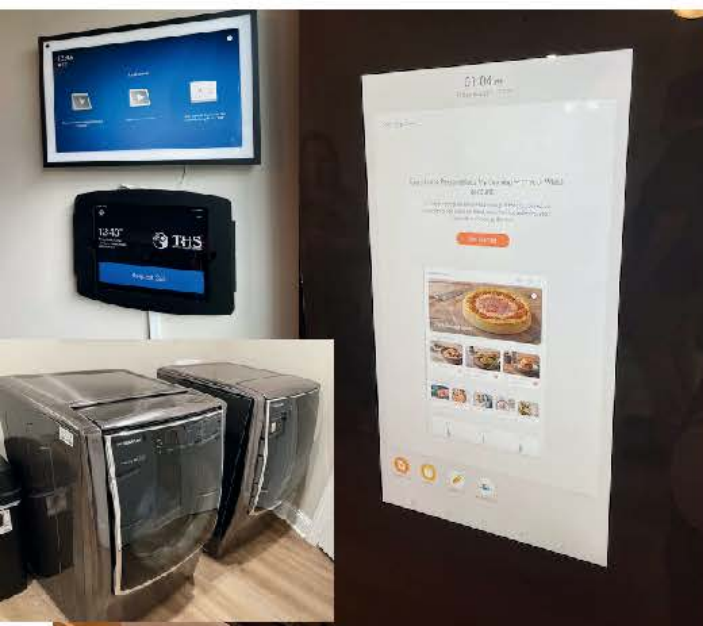


## HARNESSING SMART TECHNOLOGY

Few things help someone living with a disability develop life skills and gain independence and confidence more than a house that's equipped to meet their needs—and smart technology is making that easier (and safer) than ever before.

- **Remote support systems** connect residents to care teams virtually, reducing the need for in-home care.
- **Washers and dryers** with alarms and reminder settings help residents stay on task.
- **Refrigerators featuring smart panels** assist with meal planning, step-by-step recipe instructions, and ordering groceries to allow residents to manage their own dietary needs.

And these are just a few examples...each of our "smart homes" feature upwards of 20 such devices and appliances, on average!



## HOMES FOR PEOPLE OF ALL AGES

As we continue to grow and expand our reach, we're always looking for opportunities to meet the needs of those we serve in new and improved ways.

In 2025, we opened Stark County's first-ever Children's Home for kids with intense, complex needs who require comprehensive, round-the-clock care.

The home houses four full-time children, and every feature was thoughtfully designed to meet the unique needs of the kids living there. The Snoezelen® sensory room (pictured above) is especially helpful in reducing anxiety and agitation, while encouraging engagement, communication, and connection.
