

The mayor at the time, Clarence Lightner, spoke at the installation and challenged the CACs to work for solutions to community problems.





Current status: 10 CACs





An online survey was recently conducted with respondents across the City of Raleigh.




"Would you look on the City of Raleigh website to learn more about CACs?"



Goals for 2025

- Restore Inactive CACs
- Growth: Add 2-3 new CACs in 2025
- Grow Membership: Increase membership by 10%
- Cultivate relationship with City and Citywide Civic Organizations





Actionable Items/Request

- Fully restore CACs within three months in keeping with Mayor's 100-day Goals
- Work with the newly merged Community
 Engagement Office and Neighborhood
 Enrichment Services Division to create the new CACs.
- Enhance City Website resources for CACs including information, news, updates, videos

- Allocate Annual Funds per Active CAC:
 \$1,000 (with annual review per budget cycle)
- Use the data base of Raleigh's Registered Neighborhoods to contact civic-minded residents and connect them to CAC leadership.
- Community Center Technology and Equipment Upgrades
- Staff Support for CACs


