





The Eucharist in Ordinary Time

Sundays at 10.30am

Welcome to this service of Holy Communion. Thank you for your patience as we seek to make this occasion as safe as possible for everyone, both for those in the congregation and for those leading the worship.

Receiving Communion

In this service you will be offered the Communion bread and the common cup if you would like to receive the wine. We receive these following Jesus' command to do this in remembrance of him. Please follow the directions of the stewards.

Gluten-free wafers

If you wish to receive a gluten-free wafer during communion please indicate this when you are offered the sacrament.

Induction Loop

An induction loop is available in the church for those who are hard of hearing. Please turn your hearing aid to the 'T' setting.

Retiring Collection

A collection for the work of the church will be taken during the service. Rotherham Minster also has the Goodbox facility if you prefer to give electronically.

Children

If you have small children, do not worry if they make a bit of noise during the service. In Rotherham Minster a children's area can be found in the south aisle (to the right of the church) and supervised children are welcome to use it during a service.

Toilets

The toilets are open. At St. Paul's they are near the entrance where you came in. At Rotherham Minster, please make your way down the left side of the church, past the font and follow the signs to the toilets. **Please accompany children to the toilets for safeguarding reasons.**

Please stand as the organ begins to play and the procession enters.

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayers of Penitence

Our Lord Jesus Christ said:
The first commandment is this:
'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is the only Lord.
You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength.'

The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'
There is no other commandment greater than these.
On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.
Amen. Lord have mercy.

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ to save us from our sins, to be our advocate in heaven, and to bring us to eternal life.

Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.

Gloria

Please stand to sing the Gloria.

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father.

The Collect

Let us pray.

Silence is kept.

The President prays the Collect for today and all respond. **Amen.**

The Liturgy of the Word

Readings

Please sit. One or two readings from Scripture precede the Gospel reading.

At the end of each the reader says

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

If there are two readings, **a Psalm** may be said or sung between them.

Gospel Reading

Please stand.

Hymn.

Alleluia, alleluia.

The word of the Lord endures forever.

The word of the Lord is the good news announced to you.

Alleluia.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon

Please sit after the opening prayer.

After the sermon we may listen to some music to reflect on what we've heard.

The Creed

Please stand.

Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you are called to peace.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

We offer one another an acknowledgment of peace.

Preparation of the Table

Please remain standing

Offertory Hymn.

A collection for the work of the church is taken during the hymn. The table is prepared and bread and wine are placed upon it. The people's gifts are presented.

Please stay seated until you are invited to come to the communion rail to receive either the bread and wine or a blessing. If you would like a blessing, please bring this booklet with you. If you would like a gluten free wafer, please ask for one when you come to the administrant.

During the distribution the choir sings an anthem or a hymn.

Please stand.

The President prays the Post Communion prayer for today and we all say **Amen.**
