



## Bravo Programs of America 2024 Year-End Report

Bravo Programs of America recognize the unique challenges faced by foster youth and aims to provide a solution. We offer scholarships to those aged 18 through 26, empowering them to pursue higher education and unlock their full potential. We extend our sincerest gratitude for your help in supporting foster youths through our efforts. Our commitment lies in being a responsible custodian of your funds, aiming to uphold your trust in us through these investments.

### Cumulative Performance Highlights

The year 2014 marked the beginning of our scholarship program. Below, I summarize our cumulative performance at the end of 2024.

#### Student Performance

- 105 students have been served.
- 205 scholarships awarded with a total value of \$344k.
- 55 students have graduated.

#### Allocation of Donations

- 97% went to student education (3% to Bravo overhead), with
- 58% awarded to students who have graduated, and
- 32% currently supporting the completion of student studies.

### 2024 Highlights

- 13 students graduated, and 39 students continue working toward graduation.
- One student withdrew from school.
- We awarded 38 scholarships for a total value of \$43,000.
- Our scholarship program welcomed 16 new students this year.
- We maintained our platinum status through Candid.
- We maintained overhead costs below 3%.

### 2024 Financial Performance

Our goal is to allocate 97% of our income toward student scholarships. In 2024, we achieved a level of 97%

### Scholarship Program Performance

Are we investing in the right students? We track scholarship students' progress and their graduation rate. We compare the investment in graduated students to that of non-graduates.

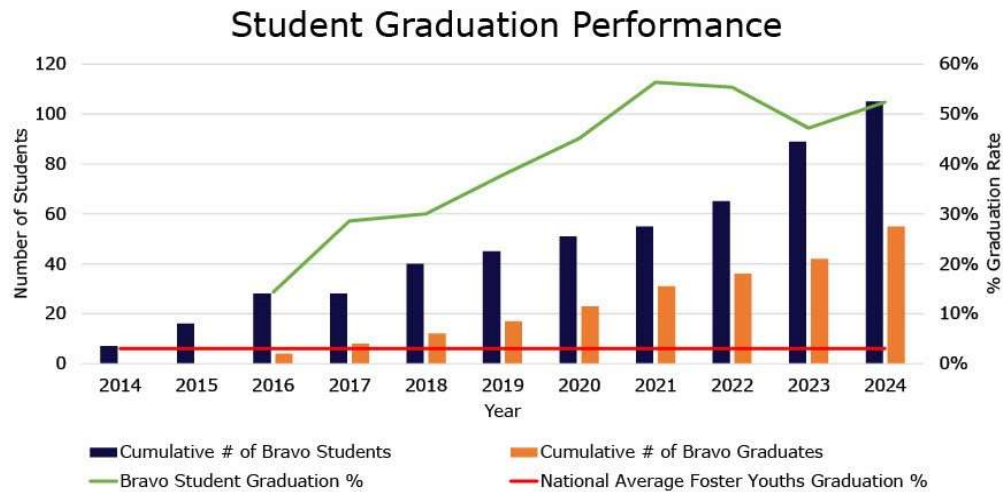
#### Graduation Rate

We consider the student graduation rate as the ultimate indicator of achievement. Our primary aim is to maintain a consistent upward trend, although it may fluctuate when larger groups of new students join. The



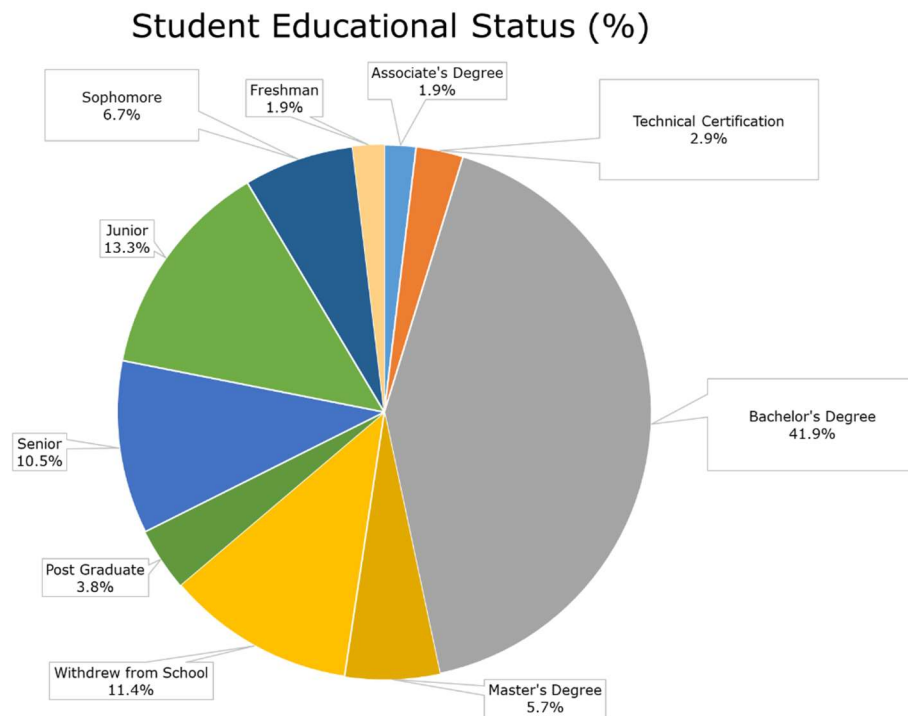

graph shows the total number of students (current and graduated) each year and their graduation rate through 2024. Nationally, only 3% of foster youths graduate, compared to 39% of non-foster youths.

## Dollar Investment in Students Who Graduate.

We analyze the money invested in students who complete their education and those who drop out before graduating. A student's financial need and available funds determine scholarship amounts. Students may receive more than one scholarship. Therefore, there is no direct correlation between a student's educational status and the amount of money invested in them. The chart below shows the percentage distribution of funds invested in students based on their current academic status as of the end of 2023.
