

# Medication for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) Resources for Pediatric Providers

In accordance with the new federal [Medication Access and Training Expansion \(MATE\) Act](#), all DEA registered practitioners are required to fulfill eight hours of substance use training upon initial registration or renewal of their DEA license. The new requirements went into effect on June 27, 2023. The training can be cumulative across multiple sessions and must be finished by the date of a practitioner's next scheduled DEA registration submission. These requirements apply to physicians and other practitioners applying for or renewing their DEA license.
