Legislative Affairs

- S 1954/HR 4150, the “Improving Whole Health For Veterans With Chronic Conditions Act”
- S 1545/HR 3176, the “Veterans Healthcare Freedom Act”
- S 1403/HR 3046, the “Medical Student Education Authorization Act”
- HR 1144, the “Department of Veterans Affairs Telehealth Strategy Act”
- HR 602, the “Veterans Healing Veterans Act”
- S 2649, the “Making Community Care Work for Veterans Act”
- S 10, the “VA Clinician Appreciation, Recruitment, Education, Expansion, and Retention Support (CAREERS) Act”
 - *This item was discussed with the Senate and Congressional offices as only one “ask” item can be discussed “in detail” in the allotted time with their office.*

Legislative Affairs

- [S 1954/HR 4150, the “Improving Whole Health For Veterans With Chronic Conditions Act”](#)

This bill would aim to improve the provision of health care furnished by the Department of Veterans Affairs for veterans diagnosed with diabetes and heart disease. Specifically, this bill would provide comprehensive dental care to veterans diagnosed with diabetes or ischemic heart disease for a period of four years to study the health-care outcomes and cost-effectiveness of such care.

Legislative Affairs

- [S 1545/HR 3176, the “Veterans Healthcare Freedom Act”](#)

This bill requires the Center for Innovation for Care and Payment within the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to implement a three-year pilot program to improve the ability of veterans who are enrolled in the VA health-care system to access hospital care, medical services, and extended care services by providing such veterans with the ability to choose health-care providers. Under the bill, the covered care system includes VA medical facilities, health-care providers participating in the Veterans Community Care Program (VCCP), and eligible entities or providers that have entered into a Veterans Care Agreement.

Legislative Affairs

- [S 1403/HR 3046, the “Medical Student Education Authorization Act”](#)

This bill provides statutory authority for the Medical Student Education Program, through which the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) awards matching grants for expanding and supporting medical education for students to serve as primary care physicians in tribal, rural, or medically underserved communities. HRSA must award grants to public institutions of higher education located in states that rank in the top quartile of states based on projected unmet demand for primary care providers. HRSA must give priority to recipients that are located in states with two or more federally recognized Indian tribes, and demonstrate a public-private partnership.

Legislative Affairs

- [HR 1144, the “Department of Veterans Affairs Telehealth Strategy Act”](#)

This bill requires the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to submit a strategy to Congress for the telehealth services furnished by the Veterans Health Administration. Additionally, the VA must report on the utilization of end-user devices provided to veterans by the VA to facilitate telehealth during FY2023 and FY2024.

Legislative Affairs

- [HR 602, the “Veterans Healing Veterans Act”](#)

This bill would amend the VA MISSION Act of 2018 to expand the Veterans Healing Veterans Medical Access and Scholarship Program to include more students and schools.

Legislative Affairs

- [S 2649, the “Making Community Care Work for Veterans Act”](#)

This bill would build upon the community care program Congress put in place with the VA MISSION Act—removing red tape from the referral process that has caused delays in care for some veterans. For providers, this bill would extend the time providers can submit bills for reimbursements in the VA; require VA to adopt national interoperability standards for the electronic transfer of health information to increase VA’s coordination of veterans’ care; and require VA to schedule internal and community care appointments in a timely manner.

Legislative Affairs

- [S 10, the “VA Clinician Appreciation, Recruitment, Education, Expansion, and Retention Support \(CAREERS\) Act”](#)

This bill aims to improve the workforce of the Department of Veterans Affairs. This includes paying for licensure exam costs for future clinicians participating in the VA scholarship programs; expanding eligibility for health-care staff to be reimbursed for ongoing professional education costs (including the American Podiatric Medical Licensing Exam); and modification of pay limitation for physicians, podiatrists, optometrists, and dentists of the Department of Veterans Affairs.




- **DISCUSSION**

- *It needs a Congressional counterpart to move forward*
- *It speaks directly to the equity of CME funding for federally employed podiatrists*
- *With the impending election, no movement on this bill is likely*

Elections



There are 2 Board of Director Trustee positions that are up for election this year. In August 2024, a nominations committee chaired by one of our past Presidents, William Chagares, DPM convened to solicit anyone interested in running for those positions. Approximately 8 people from diverse federal agencies (including the incumbent trustees) were contacted for their interest in running for the open positions and only the current incumbents remained interested in continuing following that process. As such, the incumbents are running unopposed to continue their positions.
