TRANSFERS

Transfers. Athletes who transfer under the section are subject to national championship eligibility restrictions as adopted by the National Sport Committee. After a youth member becomes attached to a club he/she may only transfer to another club in the same sport as follows:

- if the youth member has not competed in any AAU authorized events in that sport for a period of 60 days, no permission is necessary.
- If the representative of the club to which an athlete is attached, signed a release form permitting and immediate transfer. (athlete to transfer under the section are subject to national championship eligibility restrictions as adopted by the National Sport Committee)
- If the national sport committee determines, there is a good case to believe that the transfer is due to events outside the control of the athlete, or that the transfer serves in the best interest of the AAU.

Residency Appeal Process

Send appeals to Joe Gura, National AAU Volleyball Chair (jgura@aausports.org) and Ciera Hecht, AAU Volleyball Sports Coordinator (checht@aausports.org).

Appeals will be sent to the AAU Volleyball Appeal Advisory Committee for their recommendation.

Deadline for appeals. September 1st

- 1. An athlete outside of your district or adjoining district that played for your club in the '23-'24 season may return to that club for the 24-25 season. Only applies to the last club the athlete played for. Grandfathered in, but appeal required to track athletes.
- 2. An athlete outside your district or adjoining district has had tryouts prior to August 7, with proof of commitment, they must appeal.
- 3. An athlete outside your district or adjoining district has Proof of commitment, (Without Tryout prior to August 7th) for the 2024-2025 season They must appeal.
