*This document presents the cumulative verified impact of Angel Heart and Soul Foundation (AHASF) across its programs in Uganda and beyond. It combines the Foundation's 2024–2025 Year One accomplishments with the 2026 Mission Trip results, spanning direct grants, scholarship awards, infrastructure investment, and new community partnerships.*

## 1. Organization Overview

Angel Heart and Soul Foundation (AHASF) is a registered 501(c)(3) public charity headquartered in the United States, dedicated to delivering direct, accountable impact for orphaned children, vulnerable youth, and under-resourced communities in Uganda and beyond. Founded by boots-on-the-ground missionaries committed to transparency, the Foundation funds verified projects, scholarship grants, infrastructure improvements, and community development programs through direct disbursement to trusted on-the-ground partners.

AHASF operates under a core conviction: that every dollar donated must be traceable to a specific child, classroom, meal, or structure. The Foundation partners with verified Community Based Organizations (CBOs) and faith-aligned groups in Uganda, building long-term relationships rather than one-time transactions.

### Mission Statement

*“To nurture, equip, and empower orphaned children and vulnerable communities through direct, accountable compassion — touching lives across borders with dignity, love, and lasting impact.”*

## 2. Year One Impact Summary (2024 – 2025)

The Foundation’s inaugural year established the infrastructure, partnerships, and funding pipeline that made all subsequent work possible. ## Future Development: Land Acquisition (Projected / Scheduled)

Sponsor: His Church On The Rock | Projected Date: 5/25/2026

A landmark grant has been scheduled to acquire two lots directly behind Ddembelyabato Orphanage, effectively doubling the property footprint. The planned development includes:

- Lot 1: 100' x 100' — primary expansion parcel
- Lot 2: 43' x 45' — secondary parcel
- New dedicated Boys Dormitory to establish separate compounds for boys and girls
- Central play area situated between the dormitory compounds
- Two-story building facing the street side, housing vocational training courses, teacher living quarters, and administrative office space

This expansion will transform Ddembelyabato into a comprehensive campus model, significantly increasing capacity, safety, and educational programming.

## 4. 2026 Scholarship Awards — AHASF Scholarship Fund

The 2026 mission expanded the AHASF Scholarship Fund significantly, awarding eleven individual scholarships to students from Ddembelyabato and the surrounding Kyotera District community. These grants cover full school term fees for O-Level and A-Level secondary school students.

During the 2026 mission, AHASF conducted a site visit and provided direct support to Trust In The Lord Help Children and Women, a day care and primary education center serving children from Primary 1 through Primary 7 in the Luwero District.

The water tank installation addresses a foundational need, ensuring children and staff have consistent access to clean water for drinking, hygiene, and food preparation. The addition of three sewing machines simultaneously doubles the vocational training capacity at this site, directly addressing economic empowerment for women and youth in the Luwero District by providing marketable skills training alongside primary education.

## 9. Strategic Outlook 2026 – 2028

### Education

- Grow the AHASF Scholarship Fund to support a minimum of 10 simultaneous secondary school students.
- Formalize scholarship tracking and reporting, including academic progress monitoring and mentorship.
- Explore university and vocational pathways for high-performing scholarship alumni.

### Infrastructure

- Complete the land acquisition behind Ddembelyabato and commence Boys Dormitory construction.
- Build the two-story vocational and teacher quarters building on the new Kyotera campus.
- Expand the vocational sewing program at Trust In The Lord (Luwero) into a certified skills training track.

### Food & Nutrition

- Sustain and fully fund the five-year Food & Nutrition Grant through dedicated monthly sponsors.
- Explore on-property food production at Ddembelyabato to reduce long-term costs.

### New Partnerships

- Evaluate expanded grant programming with TNYMU (Jinja) in girls' hygiene and educational support.
- Identify and vet additional Community Based Organizations in underserved Ugandan districts.

### Fundraising & Sustainability

- Expand the AHASF donor base through storytelling campaigns, thank-you video series, and social media.
- Pursue corporate sponsorship arrangements (model: Roadrunner Delivery, His Church On The Rock).
- Launch a dedicated scholarship fund giving page to attract designated education donors.
