FOUNDING CONTEXT: Angel Heart and Soul Foundation received its 501(c)(3) designation in 2024 — its founding year. In that year, AHASF established its legal structure, built its website, formed core partnerships, and began fundraising. All direct program delivery launched in 2025 with the Foundation's inaugural mission to Kyotera, Uganda in May 2025. The 2024 metrics below reflect organizational formation; the 2025 metrics reflect Year 1 of active program operations.

2024 — Organizational Foundation Year

2024 was AHASF's formation year. The Foundation established its legal and operational structure, identified its first international program sites, built its volunteer and donor network, and began the community outreach and back-to-school work that defines its domestic tri-state program.

2025 — Year 1 Active Program Operations

2025 was AHASF's first year of active program delivery. In its inaugural operational year the Foundation completed 5 capital infrastructure projects, launched a 5-year food security grant, awarded 3 secondary school scholarships, conducted its first international mission trip, distributed new sandals to 82 children, completed a community church roof, and raised over \$20,000 toward its Year 2 mission trip. Every project was documented with before-and-after video evidence.

Qualitative Impact — Stories Behind the Numbers

Water Access: From 15-Mile Walks to 5-Day Reserves

Before the water tank was installed in May 2025, each power outage in Kyotera — which occur frequently and can last days — meant children had to carry containers on a 15-mile round-trip walk to a community well with approximately 350 steps down to the water source. AHASF's \$X grant funded the 3,000-liter reserve tank, restored the public water lines, and connected the UV filtration system — permanently ending this burden.

Safe Cooking: From Life-Threatening Hazards to Grand Opening

The original kitchen at Ddembelyabato had no structural capacity to safely cook even one family's meal — let alone feed 100 people three times a day. The space was compromised by smoke hazards, structural instability, burn risks, and fire danger. A June 2025 grant funded a complete demolition and rebuild, culminating in a celebrated grand opening in September 2025.

Sanitation: From Township Ultimatum to Dignity Restored

The original pit latrine facility was so severely deteriorated that children — some barefoot — had no safe or dignified way to use toilet facilities. During heavy rain it backed up entirely. A July 2025 grant funded full demolition and new construction. The township and neighboring businesses cooperated throughout the process, allowing children to use neighboring bathrooms during construction. The grand opening in December 2025 marked a landmark restoration of dignity.

Education: From Dead End to Law School

When William Lawson visited in May 2025, one of the older boys gave a heartfelt goodbye speech describing his dream of attending law school and becoming a judge. That boy — Ssewanyana Uthiman — is now enrolled in Matala CU Secondary School on a scholarship funded by AHASF. His February 2026 school term campaign is actively raising funds. Two other scholarship recipients — Christine Blessing and Mugisa Fortunate — each recorded personal thank-you video messages for donors, and each carries a specific career aspiration supported by AHASF.

A Child Who Cannot Be Forgotten: Nakalule Peace

Nakalule Peace arrived at the orphanage at 18 months old. Now four years old, she has cerebral palsy and cannot sit upright, stand, close her mouth, communicate, or play with other children. The local hospital cannot manage her condition consistently. AHASF has documented her case and identified the specific support she needs: monthly transport to LACHO Hospital, prescription coverage, a special brain and muscle nutrition diet, diapers, and separate bedding. Her story represents AHASF's commitment to the most vulnerable — those who fall through every other system.
