Block Sizing: By Trevor Baker

A lot of times before the start of a logging show whoever may be chopping that day must size a block in the event they are entered in. First you're gonna need a couple tools to get started: A fairly sharp rigging axe, a tape measure and a wood crayon. Now what we are looking for is a cylinder shaped block that measures out the same on the top, middle and bottom within a 1/16 to an 1/8 on an inch of final diameter if not right on. When choosing a block to be sized. You want to look for one that is fairly free of knots and clean wood in the proposed cutting area. A general rule to sizing a block is. "Would you chop the block that you sized?" If not, pick another block to size. There is usually a couple extra blocks in the case of finding one with really bad knots. Or you may be getting a talking to by a veteran competitor and be made to chop the messed up block that you sized. So word to the wise. Take the time to ensure you do it right the first time. And by all means if you have questions. The other competitors are more than willing to help you out. Like anything else practice makes perfect. Lastly, use that crayon to mark your initials and the block size on the end of the block when you are done, this proves you sized a block, and indicates what size you made it.
