Shared Care



Shared care is when your GP issues prescriptions and usually arranges blood tests, while we continue clinician-led monitoring, review appointments and letters.

Is shared care a good fit?

If any of these aren't true, "Blood tests included" is usually the easiest supported option.

- Your GP is open to shared care (or willing to consider it)
- You've been stable on your regimen with us for at least 6 months
- You can access routine blood tests through your GP
- You're happy for your GP to manage prescriptions

What's different in this option

Good to know

- ✓ "Stable" usually means no recent changes needing close titration
- ✓ Monitoring bands change based on clinical need to support safe care.

Blood Tests Included



Blood tests included means you use our UK-wide partner clinics for blood tests, while we provide clinician-led monitoring, review appointments, letters and prescribing support based on your results.

Is this a good fit?

“Blood tests included” is usually the easiest supported option, especially if:

- You want the lowest-admin option for blood tests
- You can't access GP blood tests easily (or prefer not to rely on them)
- You'd like PIH to arrange your blood test referral (when requested)
- You're happy to use our UK-wide partner clinics

Blood Tests: Partner clinics (included)

- ✓ You request your tests, we arrange your referral, then you book your appointment.



Costs not included

- ✓ Additional/non-standard tests outside your agreed plan (if needed, we'll explain options)
- ✓ Medication costs (paid separately, usually via NHS if your GP prescribes)
- ✓ Missed appointment fees charged by the clinic (where applicable)



Good to know

- ✓ Referrals can only be arranged when payments are up to date
- ✓ Appointment availability varies by region, so booking early helps avoid delays
- ✓ If tests aren't completed in time, prescribing may be delayed for safety
- ✓ Monitoring bands change based on clinical need to support safe care

Need help?

If you're feeling overwhelmed, you're not alone. Our team can help you work out what you need next, answer questions about monitoring, and help you stay on track without judgment.

- Clarify what's due and when
- Explain results in plain language
- Support with booking/access needs (where possible)
- Help if you've missed a test or appointment

Once your bloods are taken, results are sent back for clinician review. If everything is within safe ranges, we continue as planned. If anything needs attention, we'll contact you with clear next steps.

We provide reminders 6 weeks before tests, prescriptions, and appointments are due, but it remains your responsibility to request book your appointments, request your blood tests and prescriptions in time. Referrals can only be arranged when payments are up to date.

External Blood Tests



External blood tests means you arrange blood tests elsewhere and share the results with us, while we provide clinician-led monitoring, review appointments, letters and prescribing support based on your results.

Is this a good fit?

“External blood tests” may suit you best if:

- You can access blood tests through your GP or an external provider
- You want flexibility to choose where and when you test
- You’re comfortable managing the admin of getting and sending results
- You can reliably provide complete results on time

Costs not included

- ✓ Blood test fees charged by external providers
- ✓ Chasing external providers for missing results
- ✓ Missed appointment fees charged by the clinic (where applicable)



Good to know

- ✓ You must send the full report, including reference ranges, units, and test date
- ✓ If results are late or incomplete, this may delay prescribing or we may need repeat tests
- ✓ Monitoring bands change based on clinical need to support safe care
- ✓ If you’d prefer the lowest-admin option, see “Blood tests included”

Need help?

External testing can feel like a lot of admin. If you’re unsure what to book, what to ask for, or what to send, we’ll help you get it right, kindly and clearly.

- Confirm the right test panel for your stage of care
- Check whether your results are complete (all pages, ranges and units)
- Help if results are missing, delayed or unclear
- Support if you can’t access testing locally (we’ll talk through options)

If you’re overwhelmed, please let us know, we’re here to help make this manageable.

We provide reminders 6 weeks before tests are due, but it remains your responsibility to arrange tests and provide complete results on time. External blood test fees are paid to the provider and are not included.

We may not be able to use results missing key markers, reference ranges, units or required timing. Blood test frequency may vary depending on clinical need, recent dose changes, and your individual results.
