Among books we received are these:

The Underground Railroad by Colson Whitehead: This New York Times bestseller tells the story of a young woman slave who joins the secret network of tracks and tunnels beneath Southern soil, which became known as the Underground Railroad.

A River Road Memoir by Jane Goette: Jane, a resident of Blacksburg, tells about her journey from an idyllic childhood in the rural South to her restless adolescence during the civil rights struggle.

Burnam Wood by Eleanor Catton: described as a "savagely satirical thriller about guerilla gardening by a collective that plants crops wherever no one will notice".

The Song of Achilles by Madeline Miller: Said to carry the true "savagery and chill of antiquity... one of the best novelistic adaptations of Homer in recent memory."
