

Blacksburg Interfaith Food Pantry – First Quarter

This month we are continuing to collect contributions to fund our commitment to our Food Pantry. Our goal for the first quarter is \$5,000 to cover the purchase of soap and our holiday bags contribution. During 2025, the Pantry served an average of 368 families each month representing a monthly average of 1,096 individuals. Numbers have remained somewhat steady but there continues to be an upward tick. Below is a chart of the donations made by Luther Memorial since 2019. We are holding steady.
