From your pastor:

Many of you know that despite being ultra-careful since March 2020, I recently contracted COVID-19 and became quite ill with symptoms that intensified due to having asthma. COVID hit me like the proverbial "ton of bricks," and every day I gave thanks for the vaccinations and booster, because without those blessings, I might not be writing this today. We never plan for our health to be compromised, and it can be extremely scary and frustrating when health issues sideline us, whether those challenges are sudden or chronic. This experience reminded me that life is fragile and uncertain, but it also reminded me of God's constant abiding presence and love, as I received your kind expressions of concern, your prayers and your offers to bring over groceries and supplies. I give thanks to God for the love and care you have shown to me, dear LMLC friends, especially as a single person with no family members in this community. At the May meeting, I informed Council that though I've officially recovered from Covid and tested negative, I'm experiencing some ongoing lung issues: I become breathless without warning, I can't sing in worship, and I have to walk at a slow pace, even for short distances. With medication, good self-care and rest, my doctors feel confident that I will heal, but it may take several weeks or even months.

That's a hard pill to swallow: I care deeply about Luther Memorial and God's people, and I'm passionate about ministry. It's difficult for me to set new boundaries so I can observe good self-care, but it's a new reality I must confront and undertake. I ask for your continued prayers as we work together in service to God and neighbor, and I ask for your grace if I fall short of your expectations. I feel blessed that if this had to happen, it did so during a season of the liturgical year when things typically slow down a little at LMLC, as folks travel and enjoy a relaxed pace. I look forward to spending what I hope will be a relatively quiet summer in Blacksburg (no traffic! no crowded restaurants! beautiful weather!), as my body heals.

I appreciate your patience and understanding in the coming days, mindful of the wisdom of Jeremiah 17:14. "Heal me, O Lord, and I shall be healed; save me, and I shall be saved; for you are my praise." God is our Great Physician, and that is indeed worthy of our great and constant praise. Let us never forget that God will heal all our ills, by our baptism into Christ Jesus, who gave his life so that we may receive life eternal. Peace to all here,

*From the Finance Committee:

We are in good shape financially and we appreciate the faithful giving of our members. Luther Memorial has received generous bequests from the estates of Mary Korslund and Ben Blanchard. Mary's gift is a \$30,000 one-time, unstipulated gift. Ben's gift is also unstipulated and is an annual interest on a principal amount. This year that amount is \$10,373. It is our policy that 10% is automatically deposited from every such bequest into the Mission Endowment General Fund. Council voted to deposit the remaining \$\$ in our Rainy Day Fund until uses for those funds are determined, as Council works with the Mission Endowment Fund Committee to honor the donors and their participation as LMLC members.

*Council will conduct an Implicit Bias Workshop as requested for all VA Synod congregations by Bishop Humphrey, at a date TBD, as we seek to advocate for justice for God's people.

*Von Bora Haus:

We have a family of 5 living in the house. A quilt made by our LMLC quilters was blessed at the May 22 worship service and will be given to them. Water remediation steps have been completed.

*New lights in the Sanctuary:

Bell Electric has completed the installation of our new LED lights. We appreciate the brightness!

Our June 2022 Change 4 Change: Montgomery Co. Emergency Assistance Program

MCEAP is a nonprofit that has been serving the community since 1975 as a volunteer run organization in order to meet the immediate, emergency, and temporary needs of low-income, unemployed, elderly, and handicapped individuals or families. MCEAP helps where existing agencies cannot do so by supporting the maintaining of their households and restoring self-sufficiency. MCEAP has a food bank, thrift store, clothing bank, and an administrative office. They also offer some financial assistance that existing agencies cannot meet.

Did You Know?

The Lutheran liturgy we use for worship traces its roots to the earliest Christian communities, bringing together traditional elements designed to lift up praise and thanksgiving to God. The word 'liturgy' means "the work of the people" in Greek (*leitourgia*), reminding us that the intention of worship is not to "get something," but to participate in the joyful, privileged work of praising God in gratitude for our blessings. our baptism and God's grace. Every worship experience begins with the Prelude to set a meditative tone, and concludes with the Postlude, which sends us out to carry the Light of Christ into the world. Each time we worship, the hymns, choral anthem, postlude and prelude are selected to reflect the themes of the day's Gospel and Scripture texts as a musical gift to God, using our God-given talents. When you feel deeply moved by the Spirit to applaud in worship, please be mindful that the entire worship experience represents this congregation's humble offering to the Holy Trinity. We invite you to express your gratitude directly to our musicians, choir members and worship assistants, as a gesture of the unity we share through our baptism into Christ Jesus.
